## Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 324 would create standards for the inspection of animal shares and define animal shares within the Nebraska Meat and Poultry Inspection Law.

Animal share means an ownership interest in an animal or herd of animals created by a written contract between an informed end consumer and a farm or rancher that includes a bill of sale to the consumer for an ownership interest in the animal or herd and a boarding provision under which the consumer boards the animal or herd with the farmer or rancher for care and processing and the consumer is entitled to receive a share of meat from the animal or herd.

LB 324 would allow for the sale of animal shares under the Nebraska Meat and Poultry Inspection law if the following conditions are met:

- The meat is made available pursuant to an animal share and is:
- Received on the farm or ranch where livestock subject to share is located;
- Received by or on behalf of the owner of the animal share; and
- Obtained from the particular livestock subject to the animal share;
- Ownership of the livestock is established by contract prior to slaughter;
- A prominent warning that meat has not been inspected is affixed to the packaging;
- Information relating to the standards on the farm or ranch with respect to livestock health is provided to the end consumer;

A farmer or rancher that sells animal shares must be a Nebraska resident, register with the Department of Agriculture, maintain a record of each animal share sold, and make an annual report to the Department of Agriculture on or before January 31 for the previous calendar year reporting each animal share sold. The Department of Agriculture may suspend the authority to sell animal shares until such reports are filed. LB 324 does not allow for a person who obtains meat through an animal share to redistribute the meat in any way.

LB 324 creates the Independent Processor Assistance Program. This is applied to address supply chain disruption caused by a public health emergency, increase and improve livestock slaughter and meat processing capacity, expand market access for small livestock producers, and facilitate workforce development. LB 324 allows for the administration of funds to eligible livestock processors and sets standards for eligibility.

Funds can be used on capital improvements to expand capacity, upgrades to utilities, livestock intake and storage equipment, processing and manufacturing equipment, packaging and handling equipment, warehouse equipment, waste treatment and management, other technology that can expand capacity, building rentals if those are used to expand capacity, costs associated with increased inspections, and education and workforce training. LB 324 does not identify a funding source for the Independent Processor Assistance Program nor specifies how the funds would be dispersed (eg, grants, loans, or tax credit).

We agree with the Department of Agriculture that a program specialist would be necessary to implement this legislation, and if contracting is done to create the Independent Processor Assistance Program they estimate the cost for that operation to be \$80,000. We do not see any reason to dispute their findings.

**Explanation of Estimate:** 

Section 10 creates an administrative filing for a farmer or rancher that sells an 'animal share'. An annual report is required. There are currently no state requirements related to the listed exemptions, therefore, there are no provisions for the Department to enforce. No additional fees are identified. Providing forms and receiving information could require programming in the current system used for permits and licenses. This work would be contracted with the OCIO and is identified as operational.

Section 11 creates the Independent Processor Assistance Program but does not create receipt nor disbursement of funds.

An Agriculture Program Specialist is included to coordinate the additional issues that will arise in implementation of this LB.
