- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to adopt the
- 2 COVID-19 Liability Act; to adopt the Health Care Crisis Protocol
- 3 Act; and to declare an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 4 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the COVID-19 Liability Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the COVID-19 Liability Act:
- 4 (1) COVID-19 means the novel coronavirus identified as SARS-CoV-2,
- 5 the disease caused by the novel coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 or a virus
- 6 mutating therefrom, and the health conditions or threats associated with
- 7 the disease caused by the novel coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 or a virus
- 8 mutating therefrom;
- 9 (2) Federal public health guidance means and includes written or
- 10 oral guidance related to COVID-19 issued by any of the following:
- 11 (a) The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United
- 12 States Department of Health and Human Services;
- 13 (b) The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United
- 14 States Department of Health and Human Services; or
- 15 (c) The federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration; and
- 16 (3)(a) Person means:
- 17 <u>(i) Any natural person;</u>
- 18 <u>(ii) Any sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability</u>
- 19 partnership, corporation, limited liability company, business trust,
- 20 <u>estate, trust, unincorporated association, or joint venture;</u>
- 21 (iii) The State of Nebraska and any political subdivision of the
- 22 state;
- 23 (iv) Any school, college, university, institution of higher
- 24 education, religious organization, or charitable organization; or
- 25 (v) Any other legal or commercial entity.
- 26 (b) Person includes an employee, director, governing board, officer,
- 27 <u>agent, independent contractor, or volunteer of a person listed in</u>
- 28 <u>subdivision (3)(a) of this section.</u>
- 29 Sec. 3. A person may not bring or maintain a civil action seeking
- 30 recovery for any injuries or damages sustained from exposure or potential
- 31 exposure to COVID-19 on or after the effective date of this act if the

1 act or omission alleged to violate a duty of care was in substantial

- 2 <u>compliance with any federal public health guidance that was applicable to</u>
- 3 the person, place, or activity at issue at the time of the alleged
- 4 <u>exposure or potential exposure.</u>
- 5 Sec. 4. The COVID-19 Liability Act shall not be construed to:
- 6 (1) Create, recognize, or ratify a claim or cause of action of any
- 7 kind;
- 8 (2) Eliminate or satisfy a required element of a claim or cause of
- 9 action of any kind;
- 10 (3) Affect rights or coverage limits under the Nebraska Workers'
- 11 <u>Compensation Act;</u>
- 12 <u>(4) Abrogate, amend, repeal, alter, or affect any statutory or</u>
- 13 <u>common law immunity or limitation of liability; or</u>
- 14 (5) Constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State of
- 15 Nebraska or any political subdivision of the state.
- Sec. 5. <u>Sections 5 to 9 of this act shall be known and may be cited</u>
- 17 as the Health Care Crisis Protocol Act.
- 18 Sec. 6. For purposes of the Health Care Crisis Protocol Act, health
- 19 care crisis protocol means the plans and protocols for triage and the
- 20 <u>application of medical services and resources for critically ill patients</u>
- 21 in the event that the demand for medical services and resources exceeds
- 22 supply as a result of a pervasive or catastrophic disaster as provided in
- 23 the Health Care Crisis Protocol for the State of Nebraska published by
- 24 the Nebraska Medical Emergency Operations Center, dated May 10, 2021.
- 25 Sec. 7. The health care crisis protocol may be activated only in
- 26 <u>extraordinary circumstances when the level of demand for medical services</u>
- 27 <u>and resources exceeds the available resources required to deliver the</u>
- 28 generally accepted standard of care and crisis operations will be in
- 29 <u>effect for a sustained period.</u>
- 30 Sec. 8. The health care crisis protocol does not change or alter
- 31 the standard for malpractice or professional negligence for health care

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- 1 providers set forth in section 44-2810.
- 2 Sec. 9. (1) Each hospital shall have the health care crisis
- 3 protocol available for inspection by the public.
- 4 (2) The Department of Health and Human Services shall publish a copy
- 5 of the health care crisis protocol on the department's web site for
- 6 <u>inspection by the public.</u>
- 7 (3) For purposes of this section, hospital means a hospital licensed
- 8 <u>under the Health Care Facility Licensure Act.</u>
- 9 Sec. 10. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 10 passed and approved according to law.
