- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating schools; to amend section 79-729, Reissue 2 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 79-760.01, Revised
- 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020; to adopt the Financial
- 4 Literacy Act; to provide a graduation requirement; to change duties
- 5 relating to academic content standards; to harmonize provisions; and
- 6 to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 4 of this act shall be known and may be
- 2 <u>cited as the Financial Literacy Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Financial Literacy Act, financial
- 4 literacy includes, but is not limited to, knowledge and skills regarding
- 5 <u>budget and financial record keeping; banking; taxes; establishing,</u>
- 6 <u>building</u>, <u>maintaining</u>, <u>and monitoring credit</u>; <u>debt</u>; <u>savings</u>; <u>risk</u>
- 7 management; insurance; and investment strategies.
- 8 Sec. 3. <u>Beginning with school year 2023-24</u>, each school district,
- 9 in consultation with the State Department of Education, shall include
- 10 financial literacy instruction, as appropriate, in the instructional
- 11 program of its elementary and middle schools and require each student to
- 12 <u>complete at least one five-credit high school course in personal finance</u>
- 13 <u>or financial literacy prior to graduation.</u>
- Sec. 4. <u>On or before December 31, 2024, and on or before December</u>
- 15 <u>31 of each year thereafter, in order to promote and support financial</u>
- 16 literacy education, each school district shall provide an annual
- 17 <u>financial literacy status report to its school board, including, but not</u>
- 18 <u>limited to, student progress in financial literacy courses and other</u>
- 19 <u>district determined measures of financial literacy progress from the</u>
- 20 <u>previous school year.</u>
- 21 Sec. 5. Section 79-729, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 79-729 The Legislature recognizes the importance of assuring that
- 24 all persons who graduate from Nebraska high schools possess certain
- 25 minimum levels of knowledge, skills, and understanding. Each Beginning in
- 26 school year 1987-88, each high school student shall complete a minimum of
- 27 two hundred high school credit hours prior to graduation. At least eighty
- 28 percent of the minimum such credit hours shall be core curriculum courses
- 29 prescribed by the State Board of Education. Beginning in school year
- 30 2023-24, at least five of the minimum credit hours shall be a high school
- 31 course in personal finance or financial literacy. The State Board of

- 1 Education may establish recommended statewide graduation guidelines. This
- 2 section does not apply to high school students whose individualized
- 3 education programs plans prescribe a different course of instruction.
- 4 This section does not prohibit the governing board of any high school
- 5 from prescribing specific graduation guidelines as long as such
- 6 guidelines do not conflict with this section. For purposes of this
- 7 section, high school means grades nine through twelve and credit hour
- 8 shall be defined by appropriate rules and regulations of the State Board
- 9 of Education but shall not be less than the amount of credit given for
- 10 successful completion of a course which meets at least one period per
- 11 week for at least one semester.
- 12 Sec. 6. Section 79-760.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 13 2020, is amended to read:
- 14 79-760.01 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt measurable
- 15 academic content standards for at least the grade levels required for
- 16 statewide assessment pursuant to section 79-760.03. The standards shall
- 17 cover the subject areas of reading, writing, mathematics, science, and
- 18 social studies.
- 19 <u>(2) The board shall also adopt measurable academic content standards</u>
- 20 for financial literacy as part of the social studies standards.
- 21 (3) Academic content The standards adopted or recommended pursuant
- 22 <u>to this section</u> shall be sufficiently clear and measurable to be used for
- 23 testing student performance with respect to mastery of the content
- 24 described in the state standards.
- 25 (4) The State Board of Education shall develop a plan to review and
- 26 update standards for each subject area every seven years. The state board
- 27 plan shall include a review of commonly accepted standards adopted by
- 28 school districts.
- 29 Sec. 7. Original section 79-729, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 30 Nebraska, and section 79-760.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 31 2020, are repealed.
