## 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to adopt the Purple Star Schools

- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>Sections 1 to 4 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
2	cited as the Purple Star Schools Act.
3	Sec. 2. For purposes of the Purple Star Schools Act:
4	(1) Military-connected student means a student who:
5	<u>(a) Is a dependent of a current or former member or reserve member</u>
6	serving in the Nebraska National Guard or the United States Army, Navy,
7	<u>Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, or Space Force; or</u>
8	(b) Was a dependent of a member or reserve member who served in the
9	Nebraska National Guard or the United States Army, Navy, Air Force,
10	Marine Corps, Coast Guard, or Space Force who was killed in the line of
11	duty during such service; and
12	(2) School means any public, private, denominational, or parochial
13	<u>school in this state.</u>
14	Sec. 3. (1) The State Board of Education may annually designate any
15	school as a purple star school if such school applies for such
16	designation in the manner prescribed by the board and meets the
17	qualifications in subsection (2) of this section.
18	(2) To qualify as a purple star school, a school shall:
19	<u>(a) Designate a staff member as a military liaison, whose duties</u>
20	shall include, but not be limited to:
21	(i) Identifying military-connected students enrolled in the school;
22	<u>(ii) Serving as a point of contact in the school for military-</u>
23	connected students and their families;
24	<u>(iii) Determining the appropriate school services available to</u>
25	military-connected students; and
26	<u>(iv) Assisting in the coordination of school programs relevant to</u>
27	military-connected students;
28	(b) Maintain an easily accessible web page on the school's web site
29	that includes resources for military-connected students and their
30	families, including information regarding:
31	(i) Relocation to, enrollment at, registration at, and transferring

1	records to the school;
2	(ii) Academic planning, course sequences, and advanced classes
3	available at the school;
4	<u>(iii) Counseling and other support services available for military-</u>
5	connected students enrolled at the school; and
6	<u>(iv) Contact information for the military liaison designated under</u>
7	subdivision (2)(a) of this section and the duties of the military liaison
8	under such subdivision;
9	<u>(c) Maintain a transition program led by students, where</u>
10	appropriate, that assists military-connected students in transitioning
11	<u>into the school;</u>
12	<u>(d) Offer professional development for staff members on issues</u>
13	related to military-connected students; and
14	(e) Do at least one of the following:
15	(i) Post a resolution showing support for military-connected
16	students and their families on the school's web site;
17	<u>(ii) Recognize April as the Military Child Month or November as</u>
18	<u>Military Family Month with relevant events hosted by the school; or</u>
19	<u>(iii) Partner with a local military installation that provides</u>
20	opportunities for active duty military members to volunteer at the
21	<u>school, speak at an assembly, or host field trips for students.</u>
22	(3) A public school may partner with its school district to comply
23	with requirements under subdivision (2)(b), (d), or (e) of this section.
24	Sec. 4. <u>The State Board of Education may adopt and promulgate rules</u>
25	and regulations to carry out the Purple Star Schools Act.
26	Sec. 5. The Revisor of Statutes shall assign sections 1 to 4 of
27	this act to Chapter 79.

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
