- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act;
- 2 to amend sections 81-8,316 and 81-8,317, Revised Statutes
- 3 Supplement, 2021; to redefine a term; to change the amount of
- 4 compensation under the act; and to repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 81-8,316, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, is

- 3 81-8,316 For purposes of the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act:
- 4 (1) Firefighter means a member of a paid or volunteer fire
- 5 department in Nebraska, including a member of a rescue squad associated
- 6 with a paid or volunteer fire department in Nebraska;
- 7 (2)(a) Killed in the line of duty means losing one's life as a
- 8 result of an injury or illness arising on or after January 1, 2022, in
- 9 connection with the active performance of duties as a public safety
- 10 officer if the death occurs within three years from the date the injury
- 11 was received or illness was diagnosed and if that injury or illness arose
- 12 from violence or other accidental cause.
- 13 (b) Killed in the line of duty excludes death resulting from the
- 14 willful misconduct or intoxication of the public safety officer;
- 15 (3) Law enforcement officer has the same meaning as in section
- 16 <u>81-1401</u> means any member of the Nebraska State Patrol, any county or
- 17 deputy sheriff, or any member of the police force of any city or village;
- 18 (4) Public safety officer means:
- 19 (a) A firefighter;
- 20 (b) A law enforcement officer;
- 21 (c) A member of an emergency medical services ambulance squad
- 22 operated by a political subdivision or by a private, nonprofit ambulance
- 23 service, but excluding any employee of a private, for-profit ambulance
- 24 service; or
- 25 (d) A correctional officer employed by a jail or by the Department
- 26 of Correctional Services;
- 27 (5) Risk Manager means the Risk Manager appointed under section
- 28 81-8,239.01; and
- 29 (6) State Claims Board means the board created under section
- 30 81-8,220.

- 2 81-8,317 (1) If a public safety officer is killed in the line of
- 3 duty, compensation shall be paid as provided in the In the Line of Duty
- 4 Compensation Act to recognize the ultimate sacrifice made by such public
- 5 safety officer.
- 6 (2) The amount of compensation to be paid under the act shall be as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) For deaths occurring during calendar year 2022, the amount of
- 9 such compensation shall be <u>two hundred</u> fifty thousand dollars; and
- 10 (b) For deaths occurring in calendar year 2023 and each calendar
- 11 year thereafter, the amount of such compensation shall be equal to the
- 12 compensation amount from the previous calendar year increased by the
- 13 percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban
- 14 Consumers, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau
- 15 of Labor Statistics, for the twelve months ending on June 30 of such
- 16 previous calendar year.
- 17 (3) The person entitled to receive such compensation shall be
- 18 determined as follows:
- 19 (a) If the public safety officer designated a person to receive the
- 20 compensation in accordance with subsection (4) of this section, the
- 21 compensation shall be paid to the designated person; or
- 22 (b) If no person is designated by the public safety officer or if
- 23 the designated person is not alive at the death of the public safety
- 24 officer, the compensation shall be paid in accordance with the laws of
- 25 this state regarding intestate succession.
- 26 (4) The Risk Manager shall prescribe a form that may be used by a
- 27 public safety officer to designate a person to receive the compensation.
- 28 The public safety officer shall file such form with his or her employer
- 29 or, if he or she is a volunteer, with the entity for which the volunteer
- 30 service is provided.
- 31 (5) Amounts paid under the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act

- 1 shall not be considered:
- 2 (a) Compensation under the County Employees Retirement Act, the
- 3 Judges Retirement Act, the Nebraska State Patrol Retirement Act, the
- 4 School Employees Retirement Act, the State Employees Retirement Act, or
- 5 any other retirement plan administered by the Public Employees Retirement
- 6 Board and shall not be eligible for deferral under any deferred
- 7 compensation plan administered by the Public Employees Retirement Board;
- 8 or
- 9 (b) Regular pay or salary under the Police Officers Retirement Act
- 10 or sections 16-1020 to 16-1042.
- 11 (6) An employer of the public safety officer shall not have any
- 12 right of subrogation under section 48-118 with respect to compensation
- 13 paid under the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act.
