1 Section 1. Section 79-2902, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, is

- 3 79-2902 For purposes of the Nebraska Farm-to-School Program Act
- 4 sections 79-2901 to 79-2907:
- 5 (1) Early childhood education program has the same meaning as in
- 6 section 79-1101 and includes programs licensed under the Child Care
- 7 Licensing Act;
- 8 (2) (1) Food means an agricultural commodity or product, whether raw
- 9 or processed, that is produced and marketed for human consumption;—and
- 10 <u>(3)</u> Program means the Nebraska farm-to-school program as
- 11 established in section 79-2903; and -
- 12 (4) School means (a) an elementary or secondary public school and
- 13 (b) an elementary or secondary nonpublic school.
- 14 Sec. 2. Section 79-2904, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, is
- 15 amended to read:
- 16 79-2904 (1) The program shall provide for the purchase of locally
- 17 and regionally produced or processed food in order to improve child
- 18 nutrition and strengthen local and regional farm economies.
- 19 (2) The program shall link <u>early childhood education programs and</u>
- 20 elementary and secondary public and nonpublic schools in this state with
- 21 Nebraska farms in a manner that provides <u>early childhood education</u>
- 22 programs and schools with fresh and minimally processed food for
- 23 inclusion in school meals and snacks<u>in early childhood</u> education
- 24 progr<u>ams and schools</u>, encourages children to develop healthy eating
- 25 habits, and improves the incomes of Nebraska farmers who will enjoy
- 26 direct access to consumer markets.
- 27 (3) The program may include activities that provide students with
- 28 hands-on learning opportunities, including, but not limited to, farm
- 29 visits, cooking demonstrations, and school gardening and composting
- 30 programs, and that integrate nutrition and agricultural education into
- 31 the school curricula.
