## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 1215**

Introduced by Geist, 25.

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to economic development; to adopt the Small
- 2 Business Assistance Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be
- 2 <u>cited as the Small Business Assistance Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Small Business Assistance Act:
- 4 (1) Department means the Department of Economic Development; and
- 5 (2) Small business means a business with five or fewer employees.
- 6 Sec. 3. (1) The department shall create and administer a grant
- 7 program to:
- 8 (a) Provide grants of up to twenty-five thousand dollars to
- 9 individuals looking to start a small business. An individual shall be
- 10 eligible for a grant under this subdivision if the following requirements
- 11 <u>are met:</u>
- 12 <u>(i) The individual earned no more than fifty-five thousand dollars</u>
- in the most recently completed calendar year;
- 14 (ii) The individual has a personal net worth of no more than two
- 15 <u>hundred thousand dollars, excluding the individual's primary residence;</u>
- 16 and
- 17 <u>(iii) The individual does not have an ownership interest in any</u>
- 18 other business; and
- 19 (b) Provide grants of up to twelve thousand five hundred dollars to
- 20 <u>individuals who own a small business that has been in existence for no</u>
- 21 more than five years. An individual shall be eligible for a grant under
- 22 this subdivision if the following requirements are met:
- 23 <u>(i) The gross revenue of the small business has grown by no more</u>
- 24 than twenty-five percent over the most recently completed calendar year;
- 25 (ii) The individual has a personal net worth of no more than two
- 26 hundred thousand dollars, excluding the individual's primary residence;
- 27 and
- 28 <u>(iii) The individual does not have an ownership interest in any</u>
- 29 other business.
- 30 (2) The department shall contract with a private entity to provide
- 31 professional counseling services to individuals who are looking to start

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1 a small business or who have started a small business within the previous

- 2 <u>five years. Such counseling services shall be in the following areas:</u>
- 3 (i) Accounting and budgeting;
- 4 (ii) Tax return preparation;
- 5 <u>(iii) Human resources;</u>
- 6 (iv) How to write a business plan;
- 7 (v) Payroll processes;
- 8 (vi) Financial planning and investments;
- 9 <u>(vii) Debt management;</u>
- 10 <u>(viii) Strategic planning;</u>
- 11 (ix) Technology coaching; and
- 12 <u>(x) Financial statement review.</u>
- 13 (3) The private entity with which the department contracts under
- 14 subsection (2) of this section shall not have any other contracts with
- 15 the state that involve the provision of services described in subsection
- 16 (2) of this section.
- 17 Sec. 4. (1) On or before October 1, 2024, and on or before October
- 18 1 of each even-numbered year thereafter, the department shall submit a
- 19 report to the Governor and the Legislature that includes, but is not
- 20 <u>limited to:</u>
- 21 (a) A description of the demand for grants and counseling services
- 22 under the Small Business Assistance Act from all geographic regions in
- 23 Nebraska;
- 24 (b) A listing of the grant recipients and the amounts of grants
- 25 awarded pursuant to the act in the previous two fiscal years;
- 26 (c) A listing of the recipients of counseling services under the act
- 27 in the previous two fiscal years;
- 28 (d) The impact of the grants provided under the act, including
- 29 information on:
- 30 (i) The number of jobs created;
- 31 (ii) The economic impact on the area where the grant recipient is

- 1 located;
- 2 <u>(iii) The impact on state and local tax revenues; and</u>
- 3 (iv) The types of businesses created, listed by industry.
- 4 (2) The report submitted to the Legislature shall be submitted
- 5 <u>electronically</u>.
- 6 (3) The department may require the private entity described in
- 7 section 3 of this act and any recipients of grants or counseling services
- 8 <u>to provide periodic reports and information to enable the department to</u>
- 9 <u>fulfill the requirements of this section.</u>
- 10 (4) The report shall contain no information that is protected by
- 11 <u>state or federal confidentiality laws.</u>
- 12 Sec. 5. <u>The department may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
- 13 regulations to carry out the Small Business Assistance Act.
- 14 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate five
- 15 million dollars to the department each fiscal year to carry out the Small
- 16 Business Assistance Act.
