LEGISLATIVE BILL 138

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to immigration; to require law enforcement 2 agencies, jails, and the Nebraska State Patrol to provide notice 3 prior to entering into agreements to enforce federal immigration 4 law; to require law enforcement agencies and jails to provide information to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and 5 6 Criminal Justice; to provide the Auditor of Public Accounts with 7 authority to conduct audits of noncomplying law enforcement 8 agencies, jails, political subdivisions, and the patrol.
- 9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. For purposes of sections 1 to 3 of this act:
- 2 (1) Commission means the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and
- 3 Criminal Justice;
- 4 (2) Jail includes a city or county jail;
- 5 (3) Law enforcement agency means a police department, a town
- 6 marshal, or the office of sheriff, but does not include the Nebraska
- 7 State Patrol;
- 8 (4) Meeting has the same meaning as in section 84-1409; and
- 9 (5) Public agency means the United States, any state, county, or
- 10 municipality and any branch, subdivision, board, commission, department,
- 11 <u>agency</u>, or other instrumentality of such entities.
- 12 Sec. 2. (1)(a) Beginning September 15, 2021, a law enforcement
- 13 agency or jail shall, before becoming a party to an agreement with any
- 14 other public agency to enforce immigration law or to investigate,
- 15 interrogate, detain, detect, or arrest persons for immigration
- 16 enforcement purposes pursuant to such agreement, notify the governing
- 17 body of any political subdivision overseeing such law enforcement agency
- 18 or jail, in writing, at least thirty days prior to entering into such
- 19 agreement. The notice shall be filed with the governing body and the
- 20 governing body shall include the notice in the agenda of subjects of the
- 21 next regularly scheduled public meeting of the governing body. This
- 22 section does not apply to agreements between public agencies, including
- 23 the United States Department of Homeland Security, relating to
- 24 investigating violations of and enforcing laws prohibiting human
- 25 trafficking.
- 26 (b) If a law enforcement agency or jail entered into an agreement
- 27 <u>described in subdivision (1)(a) of this section prior to September 15,</u>
- 28 2021, such law enforcement agency or jail shall notify the governing body
- 29 of any political subdivision overseeing such law enforcement agency or
- 30 jail, in writing, on or before October 15, 2021. The notice shall be
- 31 filed with the governing body and the governing body shall include the

1 notice in the agenda of subjects of the next regularly scheduled public

- 2 meeting of the governing body.
- 3 (2) Within sixty days after entering into an agreement described in
- 4 subdivision (1)(a) of this section or, for an agreement described in
- 5 <u>subdivision (1)(b) of this section, on or before November 15, 2021, a law</u>
- 6 <u>enforcement agency or jail shall provide the following information to the</u>
- 7 commission:
- 8 (a) A written copy of any such agreement;
- 9 (b) A written copy of the notice delivered under subsection (1) of
- 10 this section; and
- 11 <u>(c) A written copy of minutes of any public meeting pertaining to</u>
- 12 the agreement as provided in section 84-1413.
- 13 (3) If a law enforcement agency or jail fails to provide the
- 14 information required by this section, the Auditor of Public Accounts may,
- 15 at the auditor's discretion, conduct an audit of such law enforcement
- 16 agency or jail or the political subdivision overseeing such law
- 17 <u>enforcement agency or jail. The expense of such audit shall be paid by</u>
- 18 the political subdivision.
- 19 Sec. 3. (1)(a) Beginning September 15, 2021, the Nebraska State
- 20 Patrol shall, before becoming a party to an agreement with any other
- 21 public agency to enforce immigration law or to investigate, interrogate,
- 22 detain, detect, or arrest persons for immigration enforcement purposes
- 23 pursuant to such agreement, notify the Judiciary Committee of the
- 24 Legislature and the commission, in writing, at least thirty days prior to
- 25 entering into such agreement. The notice to the Legislature shall be
- 26 submitted electronically. The notice shall be filed with the commission,
- 27 which shall include the notice in the agenda of subjects of the next
- 28 regularly scheduled public meeting of the commission. This section does
- 29 not apply to agreements between public agencies, including the United
- 30 States Department of Homeland Security, relating to investigating
- 31 violations of and enforcing laws prohibiting human trafficking.

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- (b) If the Nebraska State Patrol entered into an agreement described in subdivision (1)(a) of this section prior to September 15, 2021, the patrol shall, on or before October 15, 2021, notify the Judiciary Committee of the Legislature and the commission, in writing. The notice to the Legislature shall be submitted electronically. The notice shall be filed with the commission which shall include the notice in the agenda of subjects of the next regularly scheduled public meeting of the
- 8 commission.
 9 (2) If the Nebraska State Patrol fails to provide the information
 10 required by this section, the Auditor of Public Accounts may, at the
 11 auditor's discretion, conduct an audit of the patrol. The expense of such

audit shall be paid by the patrol.
