 28-318, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020; to change the
 definition of sexual penetration; and to repeal the original
 section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 28-318, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2020, is amended to read:

28-318 As used in sections 28-317 to 28-322.05, unless the context
otherwise requires:

5 (1) Actor means a person accused of sexual assault;

6 (2) Intimate parts means the genital area, groin, inner thighs,7 buttocks, or breasts;

8 (3) Past sexual behavior means sexual behavior other than the sexual9 behavior upon which the sexual assault is alleged;

(4) Serious personal injury means great bodily injury or
11 disfigurement, extreme mental anguish or mental trauma, pregnancy,
12 disease, or loss or impairment of a sexual or reproductive organ;

13 (5) Sexual contact means the intentional touching of the victim's sexual or intimate parts or the intentional touching of the victim's 14 clothing covering the immediate area of the victim's sexual or intimate 15 parts. Sexual contact also means the touching by the victim of the 16 17 actor's sexual or intimate parts or the clothing covering the immediate area of the actor's sexual or intimate parts when such touching is 18 intentionally caused by the actor. Sexual contact includes only such 19 conduct which can be reasonably construed as being for the purpose of 20 sexual arousal or gratification of either party. Sexual contact also 21 includes the touching of a child with the actor's sexual or intimate 22 23 parts on any part of the child's body for purposes of sexual abuse by a 24 school employee under section 28-316.01 or sexual assault of a child 25 under sections 28-319.01 and 28-320.01;

(6) Sexual penetration means sexual intercourse in its ordinary
meaning, cunnilingus, fellatio, anal intercourse, or any intrusion,
however slight, of any part of the actor's or victim's body or any object
manipulated by the actor into the genital or anal openings of the
victim's body which can be reasonably construed as being for nonmedical,
nonhealth, or non-law enforcement purposes. <u>Sexual penetration also</u>

includes the manipulation of any object by the victim into the genital or anal openings of the victim's or actor's body when such intrusion, however slight, is at the request or direction of the actor and which can be reasonably construed as being for nonmedical, nonhealth, or non-law enforcement purposes. Sexual penetration shall not require emission of semen;

7 (7) Victim means the person alleging to have been sexually8 assaulted;

9 (8) Without consent means:

10 (a)(i) The victim was compelled to submit due to the use of force or 11 threat of force or coercion, or (ii) the victim expressed a lack of 12 consent through words, or (iii) the victim expressed a lack of consent 13 through conduct, or (iv) the consent, if any was actually given, was the 14 result of the actor's deception as to the identity of the actor or the 15 nature or purpose of the act on the part of the actor;

(b) The victim need only resist, either verbally or physically, so
as to make the victim's refusal to consent genuine and real and so as to
reasonably make known to the actor the victim's refusal to consent; and

(c) A victim need not resist verbally or physically where it wouldbe useless or futile to do so; and

(9) Force or threat of force means (a) the use of physical force which overcomes the victim's resistance or (b) the threat of physical force, express or implied, against the victim or a third person that places the victim in fear of death or in fear of serious personal injury to the victim or a third person where the victim reasonably believes that the actor has the present or future ability to execute the threat.
