- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 37-106, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

2 2020, is amended to read:

Beginning on the effective date of this act, the Governor 3 37-106 4 The Game and Parks Commission shall appoint a secretary of the Game and Parks Commission, subject to confirmation by the Legislature, who will 5 act as the its director and chief conservation officer of the commission 6 and be in charge of its activities. The secretary He or she shall be a 7 person with knowledge of and experience in the requirements of the 8 9 protection, propagation, conservation, and restoration of the wildlife 10 resources of the state. The secretary shall serve for a term of six years and may be reappointed. The secretary shall not hold any other public 11 office and shall devote his or her entire time to the service of the 12 13 state in the discharge of his or her official duties. The secretary shall receive such compensation as the commission may determine and shall be 14 reimbursed for expenses incurred by him or her in the discharge of his or 15 her official duties as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177. Before 16 entering upon the duties of his or her office, the secretary shall take 17 and subscribe to the constitutional oath of office, and shall, in 18 19 addition thereto, swear or affirm that he or she holds no other public office, nor any position under any political committee or party. Such 20 oath or affirmation shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of 21 State. Under the direction of the commission, the secretary shall have 22 general supervision and control of all activities and functions of the 23 24 commission, shall enforce all the provisions of the law of the state 25 relating to wild animals, birds, fish, parks, and recreational areas, and shall exercise all necessary powers incident thereto not specifically 26 27 conferred on the commission. The secretary may be removed by the **Governor** commission for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct in office<sub>T</sub> 28 but only by a majority vote of the commissioners after delivering to the 29 30 secretary a copy of the charges and affording him or her an opportunity of being publicly heard in person or by counsel in his or her own 31

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1 defense. If the secretary is removed, the commission shall place in its

- 2 minutes a complete statement of all charges made against the secretary
- 3 and its findings thereon, together with a complete record of the
- proceedings and the recorded vote thereon. 4
