- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-2,144, Revised
- 2 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020; to adopt the School Safety and
- 3 Security Reporting System Act; to harmonize provisions; and to
- 4 repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the School Safety and Security Reporting System Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the School Safety and Security Reporting
- 4 System Act:
- 5 (1) Department means the State Department of Education or the state
- 6 school security director;
- 7 (2) Mental health professional means a school psychologist, social
- 8 worker, or licensed mental health professional;
- 9 (3) Threat includes, but is not limited to, suicide, bullying,
- 10 stalking behavior, cyber or electronic harassment, bomb threat, family
- 11 <u>violence</u>, <u>physical or sexual abuse</u>, <u>threat to property</u>, <u>behavior</u>
- 12 <u>indicative of extremism or terrorism, assault or attack, inappropriate</u>
- 13 weapons use, concern about mental health or substance use, sexual
- 14 exploitation or predation, and any direct or indirect threatening
- 15 statement;
- 16 (4) Threat assessment means an evidence-based process to reduce
- 17 <u>potential risks and incidents of violence resulting in harm to one or</u>
- 18 more persons or school property; and
- 19 <u>(5) Threat assessment team means a school-based team of at least</u>
- 20 <u>five members who have completed the training required pursuant to section</u>
- 21 4 of this act and includes, but is not limited to, the principal or
- 22 principal's designee, a mental health professional, and a member of the
- 23 school staff.
- 24 Sec. 3. (1) The department shall establish a statewide, anonymous
- 25 reporting system to support threat assessment teams and reduce risk and
- 26 incidents of violence resulting in harm to self, others, or school
- 27 property. Such reporting system shall be named and known as the
- 28 Safe2HelpNE report line.
- 29 (2) The Safe2HelpNE report line shall be multi-modal to allow
- 30 students, school staff, parents, and community members to anonymously
- 31 report concerns and information about a threat or possible harm to people

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- 1 or property by telephone call, text, web site, or email without charge.
- 2 The Safe2HelpNE report line shall be available to any public or nonpublic
- 3 school that has a threat assessment team and that maintains a current
- 4 list of the contact information for at least five team members designated
- 5 to receive alerts from report line staff at any time of the day or night.
- 6 (3) Except as otherwise required by law, the identity of any
- 7 individual who contacts the Safe2HelpNE report line shall be confidential
- 8 and shall not be revealed.
- 9 (4) The Safe2HelpNE report line shall be staffed seven days per week
- 10 and twenty-four hours per day by professionals trained to receive
- 11 concerns, use de-escalation techniques to minimize law enforcement
- 12 <u>involvement</u>, and alert the appropriate threat assessment team for review,
- 13 assessment, and action to protect people and property. Such staff shall
- 14 also be trained in threat assessment and management processes, suicide
- 15 prevention, recognizing mental illness and emotional disturbance, and
- 16 applicable confidentiality and privacy laws. The staff of the Safe2HelpNE
- 17 report line shall have access to clinical consultation and support seven
- 18 days per week and twenty-four hours per day from a licensed mental health
- 19 professional.
- 20 (5) The Safe2HelpNE report line staff shall immediately alert the
- 21 appropriate threat assessment team of any concern directly regarding a
- 22 student, school staff member, or school property or that is likely to
- 23 <u>impact a student, school staff member, or school property. If there is an</u>
- 24 immediate life safety concern, emergency services shall be contacted
- 25 prior to any threat assessment team. Each alert shall be assessed by the
- 26 threat assessment team receiving such alert.
- 27 (6) Each threat assessment team shall report the team's response to
- 28 any alert received from the Safe2HelpNE report line to the department in
- 29 the manner prescribed by the department. The department shall track all
- 30 concerns received by the Safe2HelpNE report line and any action taken by
- 31 the staff of the report line or by a threat assessment team.

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- 1 (7) Any information or material in the possession of the threat
- 2 <u>assessment team shall remain separate from educational records and shall</u>
- 3 be considered security records.
- 4 Sec. 4. The department shall provide training for the members of
- 5 <u>any threat assessment team serving a public or nonpublic school. Such</u>
- 6 training shall provide the knowledge and skill to allow threat assessment
- 7 teams to work collaboratively to conduct threat assessments, increase
- 8 <u>awareness of threats among school staff, students, and the public, and</u>
- 9 interrupt violence in the planning stage to thwart potential harm to
- 10 people and property.
- 11 Sec. 5. <u>It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate money</u>
- 12 from the General Fund for the Safe2HelpNE report line for ten years. At
- 13 the end of the ten years, the department shall electronically report
- 14 cost-benefit data and recommendations regarding the continued viability
- 15 of the Safe2HelpNE report line to the Education Committee of the
- 16 Legislature.
- 17 Sec. 6. <u>The department may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
- 18 regulations to carry out the School Safety and Security Reporting System
- 19 Act.
- 20 Sec. 7. Section 79-2,144, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 21 2020, is amended to read:
- 22 79-2,144 The state school security director appointed pursuant to
- 23 section 79-2,143 shall be responsible for providing leadership and
- 24 support for safety and security for the public schools. Duties of the
- 25 director include, but are not limited to:
- 26 (1) Collecting safety and security plans, required pursuant to rules
- 27 and regulations of the State Department of Education relating to
- 28 accreditation of schools, and other school security information from each
- 29 school system in Nebraska. School districts shall provide the state
- 30 school security director with the safety and security plans of the school
- 31 district and any other security information requested by the director,

- 1 but any plans or information submitted by a school district may be
- 2 withheld by the department pursuant to subdivision (8) of section
- 3 84-712.05;
- 4 (2) Recommending minimum standards for school security on or before
- 5 January 1, 2016, to the State Board of Education;
- 6 (3) Conducting an assessment of the security of each public school
- 7 building, which assessment shall be completed by August 31, 2019;
- 8 (4) Identifying deficiencies in school security based on the minimum
- 9 standards adopted by the State Board of Education and making
- 10 recommendations to school boards for remedying such deficiencies;
- 11 (5) Establishing security awareness and preparedness tools and
- 12 training programs for public school staff;
- 13 (6) Establishing research-based model instructional programs for
- 14 staff, students, and parents to address the underlying causes for violent
- 15 attacks on schools;
- 16 (7) Overseeing suicide awareness and prevention training in public
- 17 schools pursuant to section 79-2,146;
- 18 (8) Establishing tornado preparedness standards which shall include,
- 19 but not be limited to, ensuring that every school conducts at least two
- 20 tornado drills per year;
- 21 (9) Responding to inquiries and requests for assistance relating to
- 22 school security from private, denominational, and parochial schools;—and
- 23 (10) Recommending curricular and extracurricular materials to assist
- 24 school districts in preventing and responding to cyberbullying and
- 25 digital citizenship issues; and -
- 26 <u>(11) Carrying out the department's responsibilities under the School</u>
- 27 Safety and Security Reporting System Act.
