Section 1. Section 79-729, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 79-729 The Legislature recognizes the importance of assuring that 4 all persons who graduate from Nebraska high schools possess certain 5 minimum levels of knowledge, skills, and understanding. Each Beginning in school year 1987-88, each high school student shall complete a minimum of 6 7 two hundred high school credit hours prior to graduation. At least eighty percent of the minimum such credit hours shall be core curriculum courses 8 9 prescribed by the State Board of Education. Beginning in school year 2022-23, at least one half-credit hour of the minimum credit hours shall 10 be a personal finance or financial literacy course. The State Board of 11 Education may establish recommended statewide graduation guidelines. This 12 13 section does not apply to high school students whose individualized education programs plans prescribe a different course of instruction. 14 This section does not prohibit the governing board of any high school 15 prescribing specific graduation guidelines as long as 16 from such 17 quidelines do not conflict with this section. For purposes of this section, high school means grades nine through twelve and credit hour 18 shall be defined by appropriate rules and regulations of the State Board 19 of Education but shall not be less than the amount of credit given for 20 successful completion of a course which meets at least one period per 21 22 week for at least one semester.
