A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Athletic Training Practice Act; to amend sections 38-401, 38-402, 38-404, 38-408, 38-409, 38-410, and 38-411, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide, change, and eliminate definitions; to change provisions relating to licensure and scope of practice; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original sections; and to outright repeal sections 38-403,

38-405, and 38-407, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 38-401, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 3 38-401 Sections 38-401 to 38-414 and sections 4 to 6 of this act
- 4 shall be known and may be cited as the Athletic Training Practice Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 38-402, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 38-402 For purposes of the Athletic Training Practice Act and
- 8 elsewhere in the Uniform Credentialing Act, unless the context otherwise
- 9 requires, the definitions found in sections <u>38-404 and 38-406 and</u>
- 10 sections 4 to 6 of this act 38-403 to 38-407 apply.
- 11 Sec. 3. Section 38-404, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 38-404 Athletic trainer means a <u>health care professional who is</u>
- 14 <u>licensed to practice athletic training under the Athletic Training</u>
- 15 Practice Act and who, under guidelines established with a licensed
- 16 physician, performs the functions outlined in section 38-408 except as
- 17 otherwise provided in subsection (5) of section 38-408 person who is
- 18 responsible for the prevention, emergency care, first aid, treatment, and
- 19 rehabilitation of athletic injuries under guidelines established with a
- 20 licensed physician and who is licensed to perform the functions set out
- 21 in section 38-408. When athletic training is provided in a hospital
- 22 outpatient department or clinic or an outpatient-based medical facility,
- 23 the athletic trainer will perform the functions described in section
- 24 38-408 with a referral from a licensed physician for athletic training.
- 25 Sec. 4. Condition means a disease, illness, or injury.
- 26 Sec. 5. <u>Impression means a summation of information or an opinion</u>
- 27 <u>formed, which is the outcome of the examination and assessment process.</u>
- Sec. 6. Injuries and illnesses means injuries or common illnesses
- 29 and conditions which are related to, or which limit participation in,
- 30 exercise, athletic activities, recreational activities, or activities
- 31 requiring physical strength, agility, flexibility, range of motion,

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1 speed, or stamina, and for which athletic trainers as a result of their

- 2 <u>education and training are qualified to provide care and make referrals</u>
- 3 <u>to the appropriate health care professionals.</u>
- 4 Sec. 7. Section 38-408, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 5 amended to read:
- 6 38-408 (1) As set forth in the Athletic Training Practice Act, the
- 7 practice of athletic training includes providing the following regarding
- 8 injuries and illnesses:
- 9 <u>(a) Prevention and wellness promotion;</u>
- 10 (b) Examination, assessment, and impression;
- 11 <u>(c) Immediate and emergency care, including the administration of</u>
- 12 emergency drugs as prescribed by a licensed physician and dispensed by a
- 13 pharmacy for emergency use, subject to subsection (2) of this section;
- 14 (d) Therapeutic intervention or rehabilitation of injuries and
- 15 <u>illnesses</u> in the manner, means, and methods deemed necessary to affect
- 16 care, rehabilitation, or function;
- 17 <u>(e) Therapeutic modalities, including, but not limited to, physical</u>
- 18 modalities, mechanical modalities, water, heat, light, sound, cold, and
- 19 electricity; and
- 20 <u>(f) Health care administration, risk management, and professional</u>
- 21 <u>responsibility.</u>
- 22 (2) The board shall adopt rules and regulations regarding the
- 23 administration of emergency drugs as authorized in this section,
- 24 including drugs, medicines, and medicinal substances as defined in
- 25 section 38-2819 except for controlled substances listed in section
- 26 28-405.
- 27 (3) The board shall adopt rules and regulations regarding the use of
- 28 dry needling by athletic trainers.
- 29 (4) The scope of practice of athletic trainers does not include the
- 30 use of joint manipulation, grade V mobilization/manipulation, thrust
- 31 joint manipulation, high velocity/low amplitude thrust, nor any other

1 procedure intended to result in joint cavitation. Joint manipulation

- 2 <u>commences where grades one through four mobilization ends.</u>
- 3 (5) When athletic training is provided in a hospital outpatient
- 4 department or clinic, or an outpatient-based medical facility or clinic,
- 5 the athletic trainer shall perform the functions described in this
- 6 section with a referral from a licensed physician, osteopathic physician,
- 7 podiatrist, advanced practice registered nurse- nurse practitioner,
- 8 physician assistant, dentist, or chiropractor. The referral shall state
- 9 the diagnosis and, if deemed necessary, identify any instructions or
- 10 protocols by the referring provider. In these instances, for each patient
- 11 <u>under his or her care, the athletic trainer shall ensure medical</u>
- 12 <u>documentation is complete, accurate, and timely and shall include the</u>
- 13 <u>following:</u>
- 14 (a) Provide and document the initial examination, assessment, and
- 15 impression;
- 16 <u>(b) Provide periodic reexamination with documentation of the</u>
- 17 reexamination, assessment, and impression;
- 18 (c) Establish a plan of care following either the initial
- 19 <u>examination or reexamination that is in accordance with the diagnosis and</u>
- 20 any instructions or protocols indicated by the referring provider;
- 21 (d) Communicate to the referring provider changes in the patient's
- 22 condition that may require altering instructions and protocols indicated
- 23 by the referral from the referring provider;
- 24 (e) Be responsible for accurate documentation of each followup visit
- 25 and billing for athletic training services provided; and
- 26 <u>(f) Provide documentation upon discharge, including patient response</u>
- 27 <u>to athletic training intervention at the time of discharge.</u>
- 28 (6) In all other instances, the athletic trainer shall maintain
- 29 documentation consistent with the guidelines established with a licensed
- 30 physician and specific to the setting in which the athletic trainer is
- 31 practicing.

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- 1 (7) An individual who is licensed as an athletic trainer may not
- 2 provide, offer to provide, or represent that he or she is qualified to
- 3 provide any care or services that he or she lacks the education,
- 4 training, or experience to provide or that he or she is otherwise
- 5 prohibited by law from providing.
- 6 (8) Pursuant to subdivision (18) of section 38-2025, no athletic
- 7 trainer shall hold himself or herself out to be a physician or surgeon or
- 8 qualified to prescribe medications.
- 9 (1) Athletic trainers shall be authorized to use the following
- 10 physical modalities in the treatment of athletic injuries under
- 11 guidelines established with a licensed physician:
- 12 (a) Application of electrotherapy;
- 13 (b) Application of ultrasound;
- 14 (c) Use of medical diathermies;
- 15 (d) Application of infrared light; and
- 16 (e) Application of ultraviolet light.
- 17 (2) The application of heat, cold, air, water, or exercise shall not
- 18 be restricted by the Athletic Training Practice Act.
- 19 Sec. 8. Section 38-409, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 20 amended to read:
- 21 38-409 No person shall be authorized to perform the physical
- 22 modalities set out in section 38-408 on any person unless he or she first
- 23 obtains a license as an athletic trainer or unless such person is
- 24 licensed as a physician, osteopathic physician, chiropractor, nurse,
- 25 physical therapist, or podiatrist. No person shall hold himself or
- 26 herself out as to be an athletic trainer in this state unless such person
- 27 <u>is</u>licensed under the Athletic Training Practice Act.
- 28 Sec. 9. Section 38-410, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 29 amended to read:
- 30 38-410 (1) An individual who accompanies an athletic team or
- 31 organization from another state or jurisdiction as the athletic trainer

1 is exempt from the licensure requirements of the Athletic Training

- 2 Practice Act.
- 3 (2) An individual who is a graduate student in athletic training
- 4 student who is enrolled in an accredited athletic training education
- 5 <u>program or in good standing</u> and who is practicing under the supervision
- 6 of a licensed athletic trainer is exempt from the licensure requirements
- 7 of the Athletic Training Practice Act.
- 8 Sec. 10. Section 38-411, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 9 amended to read:
- 10 38-411 (1) An applicant for licensure as an athletic trainer shall
- 11 at the time of application provide proof to the department that the
- 12 appl<u>icant</u> he or she meets one or more of the following qualifications:
- 13 (a) For any person who graduated prior to January 1, 2004:
- 14 <u>(i)</u> Graduation after successful completion of the athletic
- 15 training curriculum requirements of an accredited athletic training
- 16 <u>education program at</u> an accredited college or university approved by the
- 17 board; or
- 18 <u>(ii)</u> (b) Graduation with a four-year degree from an accredited
- 19 college or university and completion of at least two consecutive years,
- 20 military duty excepted, as an athletic training student a student
- 21 athletic trainer under the supervision of an athletic trainer approved by
- 22 the board; and -
- 23 (b) For any person who graduated after January 1, 2004, graduation
- 24 after successful completion of the curriculum requirements of an
- 25 accredited athletic training education program at an accredited college
- 26 <u>or university approved by the board.</u>
- 27 (2) In order to be licensed as an athletic trainer, an applicant
- 28 shall, in addition to the requirements of subsection (1) of this section,
- 29 successfully complete an examination approved by the board.
- 30 Sec. 11. Original sections 38-401, 38-402, 38-404, 38-408, 38-409,
- 31 38-410, and 38-411, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
