- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to highways and roads; to amend section
- 2 39-1365, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections
- 3 39-1365.01 and 39-1365.02, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 4 2020; to restate intent; to provide requirements for a report and a
- 5 presentation by the Department of Transportation; to state intent
- 6 regarding funding; and to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 39-1365, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 39-1365 (1) The Legislature finds and declares that the highways of
- 4 the state are of the utmost importance to future development within the
- 5 state and that the following actions are necessary for such development:
- 6 $\frac{(a)}{(1)}$ The accelerated completion of all improvement and expansion
- 7 projects on the Nebraska segments of the National System of Interstate
- 8 and Defense Highways;
- 9 (b) The (2) the accelerated completion of improvement projects on
- 10 state highways with geometric and capacity deficiencies;
- 11 <u>(c) The</u> (3) the resurfacing of highways to protect pavement
- 12 integrity;
- 13 <u>(d) The</u> (4) the accelerated completion of the expressway system, as
- 14 such system was designated on January 1, 2016, prior to June 30, 2033;
- 15 and
- 16 <u>(e) The</u> (5) the general upgrading of the state highway system
- 17 concerning driving surfaces and surfaced shoulders.
- 18 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature (a) to appropriate seventy
- 19 million dollars from the General Fund to the Department of Transportation
- 20 to repair damages to the infrastructure of highways, roads, and bridges
- 21 <u>damaged</u> by the 2019 floods and (b) for the Department of Transportation
- 22 to apply for federal emergency funds to reimburse the General Fund for
- 23 <u>such expenditure.</u>
- Sec. 2. Section 39-1365.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 25 2020, is amended to read:
- 26 39-1365.01 The department shall be responsible for developing a
- 27 specific and long-range state highway system plan. The department shall
- 28 annually formulate plans to meet the state highway system needs of all
- 29 facets of the state and shall assign priorities for such needs. The
- 30 department shall, on or before December 1 of each year, present such
- 31 plans and the report required in section 39-1365.02 to the Legislature.

- 1 The plans shall be referred to the appropriate standing committees of the
- 2 Legislature for review. The department shall consider the preservation of
- 3 the existing state highway system asset as its primary priority except as
- 4 may otherwise be provided in state or federal law. In establishing
- 5 secondary priorities, the department shall consider a variety of factors,
- 6 including, but not limited to, current and projected traffic volume,
- 7 safety requirements, economic development needs, current and projected
- 8 demographic trends, and enhancement of the quality of life for all
- 9 Nebraska citizens. The state highway system plan shall include the
- 10 designation of those portions of the state highway system which shall be
- 11 expressways.
- 12 Sec. 3. Section 39-1365.02, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 13 2020, is amended to read:
- 14 39-1365.02 (1) The department shall apply for and make maximum use
- 15 of available federal funding, including discretionary funding, on all
- 16 highway construction projects which are eligible for such assistance.
- 17 (2) The department shall transmit electronically to the Legislature,
- 18 by December 1 of each year, a report on the needs of the state highway
- 19 system, the department's planning procedures, and the progress being made
- on the expressway system. Such report shall include:
- 21 (a) The criteria by which highway needs are determined;
- 22 (b) The standards established for each classification of highways;
- (c) An assessment of current and projected needs of the state
- 24 highway system, such needs to be defined by category of improvement
- 25 required to bring each segment up to standards. Projected fund
- 26 availability shall not be a consideration by which needs are determined;
- 27 (d) Criteria and data, including factors enumerated in section
- 28 39-1365.01, upon which decisions may be made on possible special priority
- 29 highways for commercial growth;
- 30 (e) A review of the department's procedure for selection of projects
- 31 for the annual construction program, the five-year planning program, and

- 1 extended planning programs. The review shall include a statement of all
- 2 state highway projects under construction, other than any part of the
- 3 expressway system, and the estimated cost of each project;
- 4 (f) A review of the progress being made toward completion of the
- 5 expressway system, as such system was designated on January 1, 2016, and
- 6 whether such work is on pace for completion prior to June 30, 2033. The
- 7 review shall include a statement of the amount of money spent on the
- 8 Heartland Expressway, as of the date of the report, and the number of
- 9 miles of the expressway system yet to be completed and expected milestone
- 10 dates for other expressway projects, including planning, permitting,
- 11 <u>designing</u>, and bid <u>letting</u>;
- 12 (g) A review of the Transportation Infrastructure Bank Fund and the
- 13 fund's component programs under sections 39-2803 to 39-2807. This review
- 14 shall include a listing of projects funded and planned to be funded under
- 15 each of the three component programs; and
- 16 (h) A review of the outcomes of the Economic Opportunity Program,
- 17 including the growth in permanent jobs and related income and the net
- 18 increase in overall business activity.
- 19 Sec. 4. Original section 39-1365, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, and sections 39-1365.01 and 39-1365.02, Revised Statutes
- 21 Cumulative Supplement, 2020, are repealed.
