Section 79-2902, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, is 2 amended to read: 3 79-2902 For purposes of the Nebraska Farm-to-School Program Act 4 sections 79-2901 to 79-2907: 5 (1) Early childhood education program has the same meaning as in section 79-1101; 6 7 (2) (1) Food means an agricultural commodity or product, whether raw or processed, that is produced and marketed for human consumption; and 8 9 (3) (2) Program means the Nebraska farm-to-school program as 10 established in section 79-2903; and -(4) School means (a) an elementary or secondary public school and 11 (b) an elementary or secondary nonpublic school. 12 Sec. 2. Section 79-2904, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, 13 is amended to read: 14 79-2904 (1) The program shall provide for the purchase of locally 15 and regionally produced or processed food in order to improve child 16 17 nutrition and strengthen local and regional farm economies. (2) The program shall link early childhood education programs and 18 19 elementary and secondary public and nonpublic schools in this state with Nebraska farms in a manner that provides early childhood education 20 programs and schools with fresh and minimally processed food for 21 22 inclusion in school meals and snacks in early childhood education 23 programs and schools, encourages children to develop healthy eating 24 habits, and improves the incomes of Nebraska farmers who will enjoy 25 direct access to consumer markets. (3) The program may include activities that provide students with 26 hands-on learning opportunities, including, but not limited to, farm 27 28 visits, cooking demonstrations, and school gardening and composting programs, and that integrate nutrition and agricultural education into 29 the school curricula. 30
