## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 914**

Introduced by Bostelman, 23.

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Public Service Commission; to define
- terms; to require the commission to create and maintain a location
- 3 fabric broadband access map and broadband data repository as
- 4 prescribed; to require compliance by certain entities; to provide
- for annual reporting; and to declare an emergency.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. (1) For purposes of this section:
- 2 (a) Served area means a geographical area of the state which has
- 3 broadband service providing access to the Internet at speeds equal to or
- 4 greater than one hundred megabits per second for downloading and twenty
- 5 <u>megabits per second for uploading;</u>
- 6 (b) Serviceable location shall mean any residence, dwelling,
- 7 business, or building where an entity provides or may provide broadband
- 8 services;
- 9 (c) Underserved area means a geographical area of the state which
- 10 lacks broadband service providing access to the Internet at speeds of at
- 11 <u>least one hundred megabits per second for downloading and twenty megabits</u>
- 12 per second for uploading; and
- 13 (d) Unserved area means a geographical area of the state which lacks
- 14 <u>broadband service providing access to the Internet at speeds of at least</u>
- 15 <u>twenty-five megabits per second for downloading and three megabits per</u>
- 16 second for uploading.
- 17 (2) On or before July 1, 2024, the Public Service Commission shall
- 18 create and maintain an official Nebraska location fabric broadband access
- 19 map showing broadband availability and quality of service for all
- 20 <u>serviceable locations in Nebraska and create and maintain a repository</u>
- 21 for broadband data and information in Nebraska that includes:
- 22 (a) Download and upload speeds advertised and experienced;
- 23 (b) Areas that are deemed to be served areas, underserved areas, and
- 24 unserved areas;
- 25 (c) The types of Internet service and technologies available
- 26 including, but not limited to, wireless, fiber optic cable, coaxial
- 27 cable, and satellite;
- 28 (d) The number of available entities providing broadband services
- 29 and the price of available broadband services;
- 30 <u>(e) The locations of broadband infrastructure currently projected</u>
- 31 for construction through federal, state, or local funding sources; and

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- 1 (f) Any other factors the commission may deem relevant.
- 2 (3) The commission may contract with private parties to create,
- 3 improve, and maintain the map and repository, and shall maximize the use
- 4 of federal funding when developing and implementing this section. The
- 5 commission may collect from providers of broadband services any
- 6 information necessary to establish and update the map. Any information
- 7 provided to the commission by a provider of broadband services pursuant
- 8 to this section that is confidential, proprietary, or a trade secret as
- 9 <u>defined in section 87-502 shall be treated as such by the commission.</u>
- 10 (4) Any recipient of support from the Nebraska Telecommunications
- 11 <u>Universal Service Fund shall comply with the provisions of this section.</u>
- 12 Any grant recipient under the Nebraska Broadband Bridge Act, including
- 13 any entity that operates as an eligible telecommunications carrier in
- 14 Nebraska as defined in section 86-1302 that wishes to participate in the
- 15 Broadband Bridge Program created under section 86-1303, either directly
- 16 <u>or as a challenging party under section 86-1307, shall comply with the</u>
- 17 provisions of this section. Any grant recipient of federal broadband
- 18 funding administered by the Public Service Commission shall comply with
- 19 the provisions of this section.
- 20 <u>(5) After the Federal Communications Commission completes the</u>
- 21 <u>national Broadband Serviceable Location Fabric and accompanying National</u>
- 22 Broadband Availability Map, the Public Service Commission shall annually
- 23 evaluate whether the continued maintenance of an annually updated
- 24 Nebraska location fabric broadband access map in accordance with this
- 25 section is necessary. The Public Service Commission shall report its
- 26 <u>annual findings pursuant to this subsection to the Transportation and</u>
- 27 <u>Telecommunications Committee of the Legislature.</u>
- 28 Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 29 passed and approved according to law.
