- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend sections 79-214 and
 79-220, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions
 relating to entrance requirements; to harmonize provisions; and to
 repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-214, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 79-214 (1)(a) Except as provided in subdivision (1)(b) of this 4 section, the school board of any school district shall not admit any 5 child into the kindergarten of any school of such school district unless 6 such child has reached the age of five years on or before July 31 of the 7 calendar year in which the school year for which the child is seeking 8 admission begins.

9 (b) The board shall admit a child who will reach the age of five years on or after August 1 and on or before October 15 of such school 10 year if the parent or quardian requests such entrance and provides an 11 affidavit stating that (i) the child attended kindergarten in another 12 jurisdiction in the current school year, (ii) the family anticipates 13 relocation to another jurisdiction that would allow admission within the 14 current year, or (iii) the child is capable of carrying the work of 15 16 kindergarten which can be demonstrated through a recognized assessment procedure approved by the board. Each school board shall, for purposes of 17 this subdivision, approve and make available a recognized assessment 18 procedure for determining if a child is capable of carrying the work of 19 kindergarten. The school board shall update approved procedures as the 20 board deems appropriate. 21

(2) The <u>school board of each school district</u> shall comply with the
 requirements of subsection (2) of section 43-2007.

24 (3)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the school
 25 board of each school district and shall require evidence of:

26 (i) (a) A physical examination by a physician, a physician 27 assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse, practicing under and 28 in accordance with his or her respective certification act, within six 29 months prior to the entrance of a child into the beginner grade and the 30 seventh grade or, in the case of a transfer from out of state, to any 31 other grade of the local school;

(ii) A and (b) a visual evaluation by a physician, a physician assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, or an optometrist within six months prior to the entrance of a child into the beginner grade or, in the case of a transfer from out of state, to any other grade of the local school, which consists of testing for amblyopia, strabismus, and internal and external eye health, with testing sufficient to determine visual acuity; and

8 (iii) For school year 2023-24 and each school year thereafter, a 9 screening for autism spectrum disorder by a physician, a physician 10 assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, school nurse, school 11 psychiatrist, or other individual trained in the administration of 12 screenings for autism spectrum disorder conducted using an evidence-based 13 developmental screening tool specifically for autism appropriate to the 14 age of the child.

(b) No , except that no such physical examination, or visual
 evaluation, or screening shall be required of any child whose parent or
 guardian objects in writing.

(c) The cost of such physical examination, and visual evaluation,
 and screening shall be borne by the parent or guardian of each child who
 is examined.

79-220 At the time the parent or guardian of any child is notified 23 24 that such child must have a physical examination, and a visual evaluation, and screening for autism spectrum disorder pursuant to 25 section 79-214 or immunizations pursuant to section 79-217, the parent or 26 guardian shall also be notified in writing of (1) his or her right to 27 28 submit a written statement refusing such a physical examination, a visual evaluation, screening or immunization for his or her child and (2) a 29 telephone number or other contact information to assist the parent or 30 guardian in receiving information regarding free or reduced-cost visual 31

1 evaluations for low-income families who qualify.
