- 26 Sec. 21. <u>Except as otherwise provided in section 38-2136, a</u>
- 27 certified art therapist shall not disclose any information, including,
- 28 <u>but not limited to, client records, artwork, verbal or artistic</u>
- 29 <u>expressions</u>, <u>assessment results</u>, <u>or assessment interpretations</u>, <u>that such</u>
- 30 <u>certified art therapist may have acquired from any person consulting such</u>
- 31 <u>certified art therapist in a professional capacity.</u>

- 1 Sec. 22. (1) The board may appoint an art therapist advisory
- 2 <u>committee</u>, as provided in section 38-161, to assist the board in carrying
- 3 <u>out its duties under the Mental Health Practice Act.</u>
- 4 (2) An advisory committee appointed pursuant to this section shall
- 5 <u>develop recommendations for adoption by the board and promulgation by the</u>
- 6 department on topics determined by the board as necessary to carry out
- 7 its duties under the Mental Health Practice Act, including, but not

- 9 <u>(a) Standards of competency and procedures for qualifying art</u>

- 18 (d) A code of ethics for the practice of art therapy for approval by
- 19 the board pursuant to section 38-2138; and
- 20 <u>(e) Standards for continuing competency and procedures for</u>
- 21 <u>compliance with the continuing education requirements and approval of</u>
- 22 providers of continuing education.
- 23 Sec. 23. <u>Nothing in the Mental Health Practice Act shall be</u>
- 24 construed to require the State of Nebraska, any agency of the State of
- 25 Nebraska, or any of the entities which operate under rules and
- 26 <u>regulations of a state agency, which employ or contract for the services</u>
- 27 of art therapists, to employ or contract with only persons certified
- 28 pursuant to the act for the performance of any of the professional
- 29 <u>activities enumerated in section 7 of this act.</u>
