- Dietitians and Nutritionists
- Registered Nurses
- Psychiatric Technicians
- Licensed Practical and Licensed Vocational Nurses
- Cooks, Institution and Cafeteria

This competitive advantage reflects a recent emphasis on public safety occupations and veteran services.

I would like to thank all the public servants, both State and Federal, involved in producing and analyzing the data used in our new methodology. I hope this report is beneficial to the private sector as well as to State government.

## Methodology

#### **Survey Purpose**

The State Personnel Division of Nebraska State Government analyzed salary survey data covering in-state employers in accordance with Nebraska Revised Statutes §81-1307.01 and §81-1307.02, to measure "the competitive standing of state salaries with salary levels of the labor market." As with the 2022 Local Salary Survey, a sample of the 2023 state pay lines, excluding State Colleges and the University of Nebraska system, was compared to wage estimates derived from comprehensive surveys of public and private employers in Nebraska by the Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) program.

#### Scope

The Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system, the federal standard used to classify workers into occupational categories, provided benchmarks to categorize and compare selected Nebraska Government wages to OEWS modeled estimates. For Nebraska, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) and the Nebraska Department of Labor's (NDOL) Office of Labor Market Information jointly administered the OEWS program. See the sources listed on page 5 for more information.

While OEWS sampled other public and private employers, the program collected a census of executive branch establishments for federal and state governments and the U.S. Postal Service annually. For this reason, the State of Nebraska submitted data to the OEWS program each November, and thus contributed to both the All Industries and Public Administration Sector results. For industries, occupations, and areas with insufficient representation to protect confidentiality, BLS suppressed the data where needed but aggregated it into higher levels.

This salary survey compared Nebraska State Government hourly wages (average, median, pay line minimum and maximum) and employment levels against OEWS wage and staffing estimates for Nebraska. We showed results for two industry groups (All Industries and Public Administration Sector) and three areas (statewide, metropolitan areas, and non-metropolitan areas).

#### **Occupation and Industry Codes**


Beginning with May 2021 published estimates, the OEWS program solely used the 2018 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system to classify job duties into occupations. OEWS classified responding business establishments into industries based on the 2022 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS).

OEWS industry group definitions for data presented:

- All Industries: This included model data for all employing establishments covered by unemployment insurance laws in Nebraska.
- **Public Administration Sector (OEWS-defined)**: This represents federal, state, and local government agency establishments in Nebraska with the following exceptions that are classified in other sectors: public schools, hospitals, transportation facilities, utilities, and the Government Printing Office.

#### **Metro and Non-Metro Area Definitions**

NDOL-defined areas for statewide, metro areas, and non-metro areas grouped the results by location. Statewide data included all of Nebraska. Metropolitan "Metro" Areas included the pooled results from the Grand Island Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA), the Lincoln MSA, and the Omaha Consortium (the Omaha MSA excluding its out-of-state counties). Non-metropolitan "Non-metro" Areas included the pooled results from all counties outside the metro counties listed by metro area below.

#### **Procedure**

The 2023 Salary Survey used 55 SOC system definitions as benchmarks to compare Nebraska OEWS wage estimates to State Government wages in the fourth quarter of 2023. State Personnel pulled State wage data from the human resource information system for classified agencies, excluding State Colleges and the University of Nebraska system. Over 200 State job codes, both Rules-covered (unorganized) and Union-covered, matched SOC codes and corresponding wage estimates. At the top of each page, the SOC code, occupational title, and SOC system (benchmark) definition were posted. When available, examples of job titles matched nationally from the Occupational Information Network (ONET online) accompanied the definition. Results included the following wage and staffing estimates for selected benchmarks:

- Staffing: Statistically estimated staffing level for the industry, occupation, and area.
- Average: The mean value of the hourly wage estimates across all establishments in the defined area and industry.
- 10<sup>th</sup> Percentile: The hourly wage rate higher than 10% of the wage estimates for the SOC code in the defined area and industry.
- **50**<sup>th</sup> **Percentile**: The hourly wage rate higher than 50% of the wage estimates (median) for the SOC code in the defined area and industry.
- 90<sup>th</sup> Percentile: The hourly wage rate higher than 90% of the wage estimates for the SOC code in the defined area and industry.

This differed from comparing the State's pay range minimum and maximum rates to the broader OEWS categories of entry level (average of lower 1/3 of wages) and experienced wage rate (average of upper 2/3 of wages) last year. Comparisons included the median wage (50<sup>th</sup> percentile) to show whether the average wages skewed higher or lower based on sampled wages. State job classification wages benchmarked to the selected SOC codes aligned with the OEWS wage estimates as outlined below.

Most wage results appeared as hourly rates except for SOC Code 25-2031 for secondary teachers. Since OEWS only reported annual wage rates for teachers with their varied contract days, State annual wages were compared to that benchmark.

The tables showed Nebraska OEWS data for selected SOC codes for All Industries (in statewide, metro, and non-metro areas) and the Public Administration Sector (in statewide, metro, and non-metro areas). We presented state job classes that fell within the benchmarked SOC code definition based upon their published job specifications. To protect confidentiality, the OEWS program determined what BLS data could be reported at each level. The State reported actual employee average and median wages for three or more incumbents in a class.

#### **Interpreting Data Tables**

OEWS data showed similarities and differences between industries or metro and non-metro areas within the state for benchmarked occupations. Note that the OEWS statewide staffing estimates did not always sum to the total of the metro and non-metro estimates. One reason was that some business establishments indicated they operated in Nebraska without specifying a county location. According to the OEWS *Handbook of Methods*, these businesses were "used in the calculation of the statewide and national estimates" but were excluded from substate estimates.

The table above provides details on what type of data filled each cell. Wage and staffing estimates for occupations appeared alongside State wages within selected SOC system benchmarks. State job codes began with letters that indicated their affiliation code for Rules-covered (unorganized) or Union-covered classes as listed in Appendix A. This showed differences across similar classes within occupational groups. For additional data, NDOL posted quarterly OEWS estimates on their NEWorks. Nebraska.gov website under Labor Market Information.

## Appendix A: State of Nebraska Salary and Classification System

#### **SALARY SYSTEM**

Revised 06-21-2021

<u>Compensation plans for Classified System Employees</u> are established on a "Pay by Class" system.

<u>Compensation plans for Non-Classified System Employees</u> are established by each non-classified agency head.

#### **CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM**

<u>Classification Codes:</u> The alphabetical prefix of the class codes indicates to which bargaining group the classification belongs, and which salary schedule must be used.

<u>Assignment of Class Codes:</u> The Director of the State Personnel Division of Administrative Services shall assign all class codes to all classification titles used throughout state government, excluding the University of Nebraska.

<u>Classification System Changes:</u> Any changes to this system will be published and distributed quarterly. The procedures for creating, revising and deleting classifications are prescribed in the State Personnel Rules.

**Format:** Each index of this plan is displayed in the following format:

class code - class title - hiring rate - minimum permanent rate (if applicable) - midpoint rate - maximum rate

**Note:** A class may be found in more than one bargaining group. If so, the numerical part of the code will be the same, but it will be preceded by different alpha characters and will be listed, in the alphabetical section, example as follows:

R19611 Federal Aid Administrator I	17.838			25.416
A19611 Federal Aid Administrator I	18.106			26.690
V19611 Federal Aid Administrator I	17.838	18.730	21.627	25.416

**Explanation of Class Code:** The class code provides a system of numbering, using a predetermined formula. The class code consists of a five-digit number with an alphabetical prefix.

#### **EXAMPLE:**

#### A 19 61 1

- **A** Coverage Indicator
- 19 Broad Occupational Category
- 61 Serial Number identifies specific classifications within a broad occupational category
- **1** Skill Level identifies the level of classification (for example, the Food Service Assistant and Food Service Worker and classes). Those classes with only one level have a skill level designated as "0".

#### A = Administrative Professional Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of professional employees with general business responsibilities, including accountants, buyers, personnel specialists, information technology personnel and similar classes.

#### C = Social Services and Counseling Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of generally professional-level workers providing services and benefits to eligible persons. Classes include job service personnel, economic assistance personnel, social workers, counselors and similar classes.

#### D = Doctors

Is composed of medical professionals such as doctors, psychiatrists, physician assistants and nurse practitioners.

#### E = Engineering, Science and Resources Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of professional scientific occupations, including civil and other engineers, architects, chemists, geologists, surveyors and similar classes.

#### **G = Management Non-Contract Group**

Is composed of jobs performing senior policy making and higher level managerial/administrative functions essential to the overall mission of the agency, board or commission.

#### H = Health and Human Care Professional Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of community health, nutrition and health service professional employees, including nurses, psychologists, pharmacists, dietitians, licensed therapists and similar classes.

#### I = Health and Human Care Non-Professional Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of institutional care classes, including nurse aides, psychiatric aides, therapy aides and similar classes.

#### K = Confidential Non-Contract Group

Is composed of specific positions at any occupational level which handle information or provide advice pertinent to the development, negotiation and/or interpretation/application of labor contracts, or issues related to such agreements, including human resource administrators, personnel managers/specialists and similar jobs.

#### L = Law Enforcement Bargaining Unit<sup>2</sup>

Is composed of employees holding powers of arrest, including Nebraska State Patrol officers and sergeants, conservation officers, fire marshal deputies and similar classes.

#### M = Maintenance, Trades and Technical Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of generally recognized blue collar and technical classes, including highway maintenance workers, carpenters, plumbers, electricians, print shop workers, auto mechanics, engineering aides and associates and similar classes.

#### N = Non-Classified Service Group

Is used by agencies for positions not covered by the State Personnel Salary System.

#### P = Protective Services Bargaining Unit<sup>4</sup>

Is composed of institutional security guard personnel, including correctional officers, building security guards and similar classes.

#### R = Temporary Non-Contract Group

Is composed of positions and job classes staffed by employees who are hired for a limited period of time and are not working on an on-going and continuous basis.

#### S = Administrative Support Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of clerical and administrative non-professional classes, including typists, secretaries, accounting clerks, computer operators, office service personnel and similar classes.

#### T = Teachers Association<sup>3</sup>

Is composed of employees/classes which are required to be licensed or certified as a teacher in the state of Nebraska.

#### **V = Supervisory Non-Contract Group**

Is composed of employees who are supervisors as defined in Nebraska Revised Statues, section 48-801.

#### W = Rules-Covered Classes Not Fitting Into Any Other Bargaining Group

Is composed of positions and job classes which are not appropriately assigned to one of the units or categories described above. Currently, only the State Patrol Officer Candidate class is assigned to this group.

#### X = Examining, Inspection and Licensing Bargaining Unit<sup>1</sup>

Is composed of positions empowered to review certain public and business activities, including driver-licensing personnel, revenue agents, bank and insurance examiners who remain in the State Personnel system under sections 8-105 and 44-119, various public health and protection inspectors and similar classes.

#### **Z = Miscellaneous Non-Classified Group**

Is composed of miscellaneous non-classified positions/employees that are not eligible for any benefits.
