Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB438 allows an appellate court to award attorney's fees to the prevailing party when a statute authorizes the award of attorney's fees to a party in the original civil action.

Additionally, LB438 allows a defending party in a civil action to serve a summons and complaint against a nonparty if that nonparty may be liable to the defending party or whose negligence may have caused the occurrence related to plaintiff's claim. Once a nonparty is served in this manner, they become a third-party defendant and have all the rights and obligations of a defendant to a civil action. A third-party defendant and plaintiff are also allowed to bring a nonparty into the suit pursuant to this section. Any party may move to strike or sever a third-party claim.
