Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB1169 changes the superintendent position within the Nebraska State Historical Society to a director position appointed by the Governor and approved by the Legislature. This position would report directly to the Governor. The bill outlines the duties of the director and removes the administrative duties of the board of trustees and puts them into an advisory role to the director.

The bill creates the Nebraska State Historical Society Collections Trust Fund.

The agency indicates after speaking with the OCIO annual technology costs would increase \$153,000. A large part of this increased cost is due to data storage costs. The agency has a contract with Google that costs about \$14,000 annually. The estimate is this will increase to \$98,000 annually with OCIO. OCIO will allow the agency to complete its contract with Google which will run until May, 2025. This is a monthly charge by OCIO. In FY2024-25 total technology costs will increase \$71,000 and in FY2025-26 costs will increase to \$153,000.

The agency anticipates a loss of contributions from private donations in the amount of \$1,000,000 and requests this be replaced with General Funds. The change in private contributions estimated by the agency appears to be high. However, there could be some change in contributions, and the exact amount is indeterminate.

The total fiscal impact is unknown.

It appears that the agency is projecting a loss of private donor donations of about 50%. Additionally, the additional IT costs that the agency might experience is moving from a Google cloud storage system to the State of Nebraska cloud storage solution. The estimate of costs appears to be reasonable given the assumptions

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 1169 makes changes to the Nebraska State Historical Society (Society), including appointment of the Director by the Governor, subject to legislative confirmation. The Society would be under the direction of the Director, and the Director would adopt rules and regulations to carry out the purpose of the Society. The Board of Trustees would serve in an advisory role to the Director in fulfillment of his/her duties assigned, with exception of creating classes of membership.

The Director must submit a biennial report to the Governor and would be required to annually report all gifts to the Governor and Legislature. The Director oversees gifts to the Society and may accept monetary gifts under \$10,000 and gifts that are not real property without the Governor's approval. Gifts of monetary value of \$10,000 or more or gifts of real property would require the Governor's approval. The Director of the Nebraska State Historical Society may not serve as a board member or in an advisory role for a charitable organization that provides money or other support to the Society.

There is no fiscal impact of LB 1169 to DAS.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 1169 essentially makes the Nebraska State Historical Society a code agency.

If History Nebraska were to become a code agency, we anticipate that private donations would diminish. In order to fulfill agency mission and meet statutory obligations, private cash support would need to be replaced with General Funds. We plan on raising \$1,000,000 in contributions in the next fiscal year, which would need to be replaced with State funding.

History Nebraska maintains an enormous amount of electronic data, from databases, to scans of historic records, all of which is currently stored in a cloud and locally hosted space. One of the major changes with becoming a code agency would be all of History Nebraska's infrastructure, security, data, and servers moving under the direct authority of the OCIO. This is expected to increase our annual technology costs tremendously. From the cost estimates provided by the OCIO this transition could see cost increases exceeding \$153K. Additionally with this transition there is an unknown cost associated with changing existing processes, application use, and/or support to maintain standards.
