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1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend section 70,
2	Legislative Bill 1412, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second
3	Session, 2024; to appropriate funds to aid in carrying out the
4	provisions of Legislative Bill 204, One Hundred Eighth Legislature,
5	Second Session, 2024; to provide for expenditures for aid; to repeal
6	the original section; and to declare an emergency.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated (1) \$-0- from the General
- 2 Fund for FY2023-24 and (2) \$75,000 from the General Fund for FY2024-25 to
- 3 the Department of Health and Human Services, for Program 33, to aid in
- 4 carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 204, One Hundred Eighth
- 5 Legislature, Second Session, 2024.
- 6 No expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems
- 7 for state employees shall be made from funds appropriated in this
- 8 section.
- 9 Sec. 2. Section 70, Legislative Bill 1412, One Hundred Eighth
- 10 Legislature, Second Session, 2024, is amended to read:
- 11 Sec. 70. AGENCY NO. 25 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
- 12 Program No. 348 Medical Assistance

- 18 The Department of Administrative Services shall monitor the
- 19 appropriations and expenditures for this program according to the
- 20 following program classification:
- No. 348 Medical Assistance
- No. 349 Medicaid Expansion Aid
- There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24
- 24 \$1,000,583,595 General Funds, \$133,894,141 Cash Funds, and \$2,429,949,804
- 25 Federal Funds estimate for state aid, which shall only be used for such
- 26 purpose. There is included in the appropriation to this program for
- 27 FY2024-25 \$1,004,665,399 General Funds, \$72,117,244 Cash Funds, and
- 28 \$2,075,656,145 Federal Funds estimate for state aid, which shall only be
- 29 used for such purpose.
- There is included in the amount shown as aid for this program for
- 31 FY2023-24 \$450,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund for

- 1 a state plan amendment covering tobacco-use cessation in compliance with
- 2 Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act. There is included in the
- 3 amount shown as aid for this program for FY2024-25 \$450,000 Cash Funds
- 4 from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund for a state plan amendment
- 5 covering tobacco-use cessation in compliance with Title XIX of the
- 6 federal Social Security Act. The smoking cessation funding for FY2023-24
- 7 and FY2024-25 is for the costs of tobacco-use cessation counseling and
- 8 tobacco-use cessation pharmaceuticals approved by the federal Food and
- 9 Drug Administration for such purpose.
- There is included in the amount shown as aid for this program for
- 11 FY2023-24 \$-0- General Funds and \$-0- Federal Funds and for FY2024-25
- 12 \$2,510,597 General Funds and \$4,466,385 Federal Funds for pharmacy
- 13 <u>dispensing fees for independent pharmacies.</u>
- It is the intent of the Legislature that phased-down state
- 15 contributions to the federal government as defined and required by the
- 16 federal Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of
- 17 2003 may be made from appropriations to this program.
- 18 The chief executive officer of the Department of Health and Human
- 19 Services may certify to the budget administrator of the budget division
- 20 of the Department of Administrative Services FY2023-24 and FY2024-25
- 21 unexpended appropriation balances for Medical Assistance, Program No.
- 22 348, available to transfer to Developmental Disability Aid, Program No.
- 23 424, to be used only to maintain individuals with an intellectual or
- 24 developmental disability in a medicaid program that best serves their
- 25 needs at a cost that does not exceed the cost of services provided in an
- 26 institution. The budget administrator of the budget division of the
- 27 Department of Administrative Services shall administratively transfer
- 28 during FY2023-24 and FY2024-25 available appropriations as certified by
- 29 the chief executive officer of the Department of Health and Human
- 30 Services from Medical Assistance, Program No. 348, to Developmental
- 31 Disability Aid, Program No. 424.

- 1 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health
- 2 and Human Services provide monthly status reports electronically to the
- 3 Clerk of the Legislature and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst on medicaid
- 4 expansion. The department shall include in the report information on
- 5 policy decisions on services, community engagement, wellness
- 6 requirements, and rate setting.
- 7 It is the intent of the Legislature that the total amount
- 8 appropriated for medicaid nursing facility rates for Program No. 348,
- 9 specified as \$449,351,518 for FY2023-24 (\$186,851,595 General Funds and
- 10 \$262,499,923 Federal Funds) and \$449,351,518 for FY2024-25 (\$186,031,528
- 11 General Funds and \$263,319,990 Federal Funds), shall be used in the
- 12 medicaid nursing facility rate calculation for Program No. 348, including
- 13 the calculation of the annual inflation factor.
- 14 The total amount appropriated for medicaid nursing facility rates
- 15 for Program No. 348 includes amounts for rate enhancement and any other
- 16 purpose related to medicaid nursing facility services. The department
- 17 shall file a report electronically with the Legislative Fiscal Analyst
- and the Clerk of the Legislature no later than August 1, 2023, on how the
- 19 inflation factor was calculated for FY2023-24 rates and no later than
- 20 August 1, 2024, on how the inflation factor was calculated for FY2024-25
- 21 rates.
- 22 The department shall file a report electronically with the
- 23 Legislative Fiscal Analyst and the Clerk of the Legislature between
- 24 December 15 and December 31 of each year of the biennium ending June 30,
- 25 2025, identifying the amount of any unspent remaining appropriation from
- 26 the prior fiscal year's appropriations earmarked for nursing facility
- 27 payments. The report shall include an identification of encumbrances and
- 28 retroactive payments.
- 29 Sec. 3. Original section 70, Legislative Bill 1412, One Hundred
- 30 Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024, is repealed.
- 31 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when

1 passed and approved according to law.
