- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Credentialing Act; to amend 1 sections 38-2102, 38-2103, and 38-2120, Reissue Revised Statutes of 2 Nebraska, sections 38-2101, 38-2104, 38-2116, 38-2117, 38-2121, 3 38-2122, 38-2124, 38-2130, and 38-2139, Revised Statutes Cumulative 4 Supplement, 2022, and section 38-121, Revised Statutes Supplement, 5 2023; to change provisions of the Mental Health Practice Act to 6 7 include protections and requirements for certified art therapists; 8 to define terms; to change the membership of the Board of Mental 9 Health Practice; to provide powers and duties to the Board of Mental 10 Health Practice; to harmonize provisions; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the original sections. 11

- 22 receipt of certification as a certified art therapist or five years after
