1 Section 1. Section 29-2101, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 29-2101 A new trial, after a verdict of conviction, may be granted,
- 4 on the application of the defendant, for any of the following grounds
- 5 affecting materially affecting his or her substantial rights:
- 6 (1) Irregularity in the proceedings of the court, of the prosecuting
- 7 attorney, or of the witnesses for the state or in any order of the court
- 8 or abuse of discretion by which the defendant was prevented from having a
- 9 fair trial;
- 10 (2) Misconduct misconduct of the jury, of the prosecuting attorney,
- 11 or of the witnesses for the state;
- 12 (3) Accident accident or surprise which ordinary prudence could not
- 13 have guarded against;
- 14 (4) The the verdict is not sustained by sufficient evidence or is
- 15 contrary to law;
- 16 (5) Newly newly discovered evidence material for the defendant which
- 17 he or she could not with reasonable diligence have discovered <u>or</u> and
- 18 produced at the trial. For purposes of this subdivision, testimony or
- 19 <u>evidence from a witness who previously had a testimonial or</u>
- 20 constitutional privilege and who, because of such privilege, refused to
- 21 testify or produce evidence in a prior proceeding, shall be considered
- 22 newly discovered evidence;
- 23 (6) Newly newly discovered exculpatory DNA or similar forensic
- 24 testing evidence obtained under the DNA Testing Act; or
- 25 (7) Error error of law occurring at the trial.
- 26 <u>The changes made to this section by this legislative bill shall</u>
- 27 apply to all persons, otherwise eligible in accordance with the
- 28 provisions of this section, whether convicted prior to, on, or subsequent
- 29 to the effective date of this act.
- 30 Sec. 2. Section 29-2103, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 31 amended to read:

- 1 29-2103 (1) A motion for new trial shall be made by written
- 2 application and may be filed either during or after the term of the court
- 3 at which the verdict was rendered.
- 4 (2) A motion for a new trial shall state the grounds under section
- 5 29-2101 which are the basis for the motion and shall be supported by
- 6 evidence as provided in section 29-2102.
- 7 (3) A motion for new trial based on the grounds set forth in
- 8 subdivision (1), (2), (3), (4), or (7) of section 29-2101 shall be filed
- 9 within ten days after the verdict was rendered unless such filing is
- 10 unavoidably prevented, and the grounds for such motion may be stated by
- 11 directly incorporating the appropriate language of section 29-2101
- 12 without further particularity.
- 13 (4)(a) Except as provided in subdivision (4)(b) of this section, a
- 14 (4) A motion for new trial based on the grounds set forth in subdivision
- 15 (5) of section 29-2101 shall be filed within a reasonable time after the
- 16 discovery of the new evidence and cannot be filed more than five years
- 17 after the date of the verdict, unless the motion and supporting documents
- 18 show the new evidence could not with reasonable diligence have been
- 19 discovered or and produced at trial and such evidence is so substantial
- 20 that a different result may have occurred.
- 21 (b) The time limitation in this subsection does not apply if the
- 22 motion for a new trial involves a conviction for a Class I, IA, or IB
- 23 <u>felony</u>.
- 24 (5) A motion for new trial based on the grounds set forth in
- 25 subdivision (6) of section 29-2101 shall be filed within ninety days
- 26 after a final order is issued under section 29-4123 or within ninety days
- 27 after the hearing if no final order is entered, whichever occurs first.
- 28 (6) The changes made to this section by this legislative bill shall
- 29 apply to all persons, otherwise eligible in accordance with the
- 30 provisions of this section, whether convicted prior to, on, or subsequent
- 31 to the effective date of this act.
