- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to home inspection; to amend sections 76-3602,
 76-3603, and 76-3604, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022;
 to change provisions relating to home inspector registration and
 change in information reporting; and to repeal the original
 sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 76-3602, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2022, is amended to read:

76-3602 (1) Before conducting home inspections in this state and in 3 4 each even-numbered year, a home inspector shall register with the Secretary of State. If the home inspector is an individual, the home 5 inspector shall sign such registration. If the home inspector is a firm, 6 7 partnership, corporation, company, association, limited liability company, or other legal entity, an officer or agent of the home inspector 8 9 shall sign such registration. Such registration shall include:

(a) (1) The name of the home inspector if the home inspector is an
 individual or the name of the legal entity under which such home
 inspector proposes to register and transact business in this state;

(b) (2) The address of the home office of the home inspector;

14 <u>(c)</u> (3) The name and address of the agent for service of process on 15 the home inspector; and

16 (d) (4) Any national certification relating to home inspection 17 currently held by the home inspector.

18 (2) A home inspector may apply to renew a registration by submitting
 19 an application for renewal in a form prescribed by the Secretary of State
 20 within forty-five days prior to the expiration of the registration.

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(3) A registration for a home inspector is valid for two years.

22 Sec. 2. Section 76-3603, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 23 2022, is amended to read:

76-3603 At the time of registration <u>or renewal of a registration</u>
pursuant to section 76-3602, a home inspector shall:

(1) Pay a registration <u>or renewal</u> fee to the Secretary of State. The
Secretary of State shall set such registration <u>or renewal</u> fee in an
amount sufficient to defray the administrative costs of registration <u>or</u>
<u>renewal</u> but not to exceed three hundred dollars. The Secretary of State
shall remit such registration <u>or renewal</u> fee to the State Treasurer for
credit to the Secretary of State Cash Fund; and

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6 76-3604 A home inspector shall report a change in information 7 required by section 76-3602 or 76-3603 within <u>forty-five</u> thirty business 8 days of such change.
