- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Visitors Development Act; to
 amend sections 81-3710 and 81-3711, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2022; to provide for the administration of the Nebraska
 Tourism Commission as prescribed; to provide duties for the Director
 of Economic Development; to eliminate obsolete provisions; to change
 commission duties; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
 original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. Section 81-3710, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2022, is amended to read:
- 3 81-3710 (1) The Nebraska Tourism Commission is created. For
- 4 administrative purposes, the commission shall be located and staffed
- 5 within the Department of Economic Development. The Director of Economic
- 6 Development shall appoint the executive director of the commission at a
- 7 salary fixed by the Director of Economic Development. The executive
- 8 director shall conduct the day-to-day operations of the commission and
- 9 <u>serve at the pleasure of the Director of Economic Development.</u> The terms
- 10 of the members serving pursuant to subsection (2) of this section
- 11 terminate thirty days after August 24, 2017. The terms of the members
- 12 serving pursuant to subsection (3) of this section begin thirty days
- 13 after August 24, 2017.
- 14 (2) Until thirty days after August 24, 2017, the commission shall
- 15 consist of the following members:
- 16 (a) One representative from the Game and Parks Commission;
- 17 (b) One representative from the Nebraska Travel Association;
- 18 (c) One representative from the Nebraska Hotel and Motel
- 19 Association;
- 20 (d) One representative from a tourism attraction that records at
- 21 least two thousand out-of-state visitors per year;
- 22 (e) One representative from the Nebraska Association of Convention
- 23 and Visitors Bureaus;
- 24 (f) One representative from the Western Nebraska Tourism Coalition;
- 25 (g) One representative who resides in eastern Nebraska and is
- 26 employed by a business that derives a majority of its revenue from out-
- 27 of-state visitors;
- 28 (h) One representative from the Central Nebraska Tourism
- 29 Partnership; and
- 30 (i) One representative of a business that derives a majority of its
- 31 revenue from out-of-state visitors.

- 1 (2)(a) (3)(a) The Governor shall, within thirty days after August
- 2 24, 2017, appoint the members of the commission to begin serving at such
- 3 time, prior to approval by the Legislature. The members shall consist of
- 4 eleven residents of the State of Nebraska. Four of the members shall have
- 5 professional, volunteer, or public service experience that contributes to
- 6 the fiduciary and governance duties of the commission. Seven of the
- 7 members shall be affiliated with the tourism industry. One member shall
- 8 be appointed from each of the eleven districts designated in subdivision
- 9 (b) of this subsection.
- 10 (b) For purposes of this section, the state is hereby divided into
- 11 eleven districts. The limits and designations of the eleven districts
- 12 shall be as follows:
- 13 (i) District No. 1. Douglas County;
- 14 (ii) District No. 2. Lancaster County;
- 15 (iii) District No. 3. The counties of Richardson, Pawnee, Nemaha,
- 16 Johnson, Otoe, Gage, Saline, and Jefferson;
- 17 (iv) District No. 4. The counties of Cass and Sarpy;
- 18 (v) District No. 5. The counties of Saunders, Washington, Dodge,
- 19 Colfax, Stanton, Cuming, Burt, Thurston, Wayne, Cedar, Dixon, and Dakota;
- 20 (vi) District No. 6. The counties of Butler, Polk, Platte, Merrick,
- 21 Nance, Boone, Madison, Pierce, Antelope, Knox, Holt, and Boyd;
- 22 (vii) District No. 7. The counties of Thayer, Nuckolls, Webster,
- 23 Adams, Clay, Fillmore, Seward, York, Hamilton, Franklin, and Harlan;
- 24 (viii) District No. 8. The counties of Kearney, Phelps, Hall,
- 25 Howard, Greeley, Wheeler, Buffalo, Sherman, Valley, and Garfield;
- 26 (ix) District No. 9. The counties of Lincoln, Keya Paha, Rock,
- 27 Brown, Loup, Blaine, Custer, Logan, McPherson, Arthur, Grant, Hooker,
- 28 Thomas, and Cherry;
- 29 (x) District No. 10. The counties of Furnas, Red Willow, Hitchcock,
- 30 Dundy, Chase, Hayes, Frontier, Gosper, Dawson, Perkins, and Keith; and
- 31 (xi) District No. 11. The counties of Deuel, Garden, Sheridan,

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- 1 Cheyenne, Morrill, Box Butte, Dawes, Sioux, Scotts Bluff, Banner, and
- 2 Kimball.
- 3 (c) The Governor shall appoint members representing district numbers
- 4 1, 6, 8, and 11 to serve for terms ending April 1, 2019; members
- 5 representing district numbers 2, 5, 7, and 10 to serve for terms ending
- 6 April 1, 2021; and members representing district numbers 3, 4, and 9 to
- 7 serve for terms ending April 1, 2023. The terms of their successors shall
- 8 be four years. The Governor shall appoint their successors with the
- 9 approval of the majority of the members of the Legislature. A person
- 10 appointed to serve pursuant to this subsection may serve only two
- 11 successive terms.
- 12 Sec. 2. Section 81-3711, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 13 2022, is amended to read:
- 14 81-3711 The commission shall:
- 15 (1) Administer the Nebraska Visitors Development Act;
- 16 (2) Advise the executive director in preparing a budget Prepare and
- 17 approve <u>such</u> a budget;
- 18 (3) Elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson;
- 19 (4) Procure and evaluate data and information necessary for the
- 20 proper administration of the act;
- 21 (5) Recommend Appoint an executive director for appointment by the
- 22 Director of Economic Development at a salary to be fixed by the
- 23 commission to conduct the day-to-day operations of the commission;
- 24 (6) Approve the employment of Employ personnel and contracts
- 25 contract for services which are necessary for the proper operation of the
- 26 commission;
- 27 (7) Establish a means by which any interested person has the
- 28 opportunity at least annually to offer his or her ideas and suggestions
- 29 relative to the commission's duties for the upcoming year;
- 30 (8) Authorize the expenditure of funds and contracting of
- 31 expenditures to carry out the act;

- 1 (9) Keep minutes of its meetings and other books and records which
- 2 clearly reflect all of the actions and transactions of the commission and
- 3 keep such records open to examination during normal business hours;
- 4 (10) Prohibit any funds appropriated to the commission from being
- 5 expended directly or indirectly to promote or oppose any candidate for
- 6 public office or to influence state or federal legislation;
- 7 (11) Have authority to mark significant tourism attractions as
- 8 provided in section 81-3711.01;
- 9 (12) Have authority to develop and approve state marketing
- 10 campaigns;
- 11 (13) Adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the <u>act</u>
- 12 Nebraska Visitors Development Act;
- 13 (14) Develop and administer a program to provide promotional
- 14 services, technical assistance, and state aid to local governments and
- 15 the tourism industry;
- 16 (15) Establish written policies and procedures governing the
- 17 executive director and the personnel of the commission, as approved by
- 18 the <u>Director of Economic Development</u>, in the expenditure and use of funds
- 19 appropriated to the commission;
- 20 (16) Cooperate with federal, state, and local governments and
- 21 private individuals and organizations to carry out any of the functions
- 22 of the commission and the purposes of the act Nebraska Visitors
- 23 Development Act; and
- 24 (17) Actively coordinate and develop working partnerships with other
- 25 state agencies, including, but not limited to, the Commission on Indian
- 26 Affairs, the Department of Economic Development, the Game and Parks
- 27 Commission, the Nebraska Arts Council, the Nebraska State Historical
- 28 Society, and the University of Nebraska.
