- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-734, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change provisions relating
- 3 to the purchase and loan of textbooks for children enrolled in
- kindergarten to grade twelve of a private school as prescribed; to
- 5 provide powers and duties to the State Department of Education; to
- 6 define a term; and to repeal the original section.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 79-734, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2022, is amended to read:
- 3 79-734 (1)(a) (1) School boards and boards of education of all
- 4 classes of school districts shall purchase all textbooks, equipment, and
- 5 supplies necessary for the schools of such district. The duty to make
- 6 such purchases may be delegated to employees of the school district.
- 7 $\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{(2)}}$ School boards and boards of education shall purchase and
- 8 loan textbooks to all children who are enrolled in kindergarten to grade
- 9 twelve of a public school. and,
- 10 (c) School boards and boards of education may adopt rules to carry
- 11 out this subsection.
- 12 (2)(a) Through June 30, 2024, school boards and boards of education
- 13 <u>shall purchase and loan textbooks</u>, upon individual request, to children
- 14 who are enrolled in kindergarten to grade twelve of a private school
- 15 which is approved for continued legal operation under rules and
- 16 regulations established by the State Board of Education pursuant to
- 17 subdivision (5)(c) of section 79-318. The Legislature may appropriate
- 18 funds to carry out the provisions of this subdivision subsection. A
- 19 school district is not obligated to spend any money for the purchase and
- 20 loan of textbooks to children enrolled in private schools other than
- 21 funds specifically appropriated by the Legislature to be distributed by
- 22 the State Department of Education for the purpose of purchasing and
- 23 loaning textbooks as provided in this subdivision subsection. Textbooks
- 24 loaned to children enrolled in kindergarten to grade twelve of such
- 25 private schools shall be textbooks which are designated for use in the
- 26 public schools of the school district in which the child resides or the
- 27 school district in which the private school the child attends is located.
- 28 Such textbooks shall be loaned free to such children subject to such
- 29 rules and regulations as are or may be prescribed by such school boards
- 30 or boards of education. The State Department of Education shall adopt and
- 31 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section. The rules and

regulations shall include provisions for the distribution of funds 1 2 appropriated for textbooks. The rules and regulations shall include a deadline for applications from school districts for distribution of 3 4 funds. If funds are not appropriated to cover the entire cost of 5 applications, a pro rata reduction shall be made. It is the intent of the Legislature that on or before October 1, 2016, the department provide to 6 7 the Education Committee of the Legislature recommended changes to this subsection that reflect advances in technology and educational content 8 9 for students.

10 (b) Beginning on July 1, 2024, the State Department of Education shall purchase and loan textbooks, upon individual request, to children 11 who are enrolled in kindergarten to grade twelve of a private school 12 which is approved for continued legal operation under rules and 13 regulations established by the State Board of Education pursuant to 14 subdivision (5)(c) of section 79-318. The Legislature may appropriate 15 16 funds to carry out the provisions of this subdivision. The State 17 Department of Education is not obligated to spend any money for the purchase and loan of textbooks to children enrolled in private schools 18 19 other than funds specifically appropriated by the Legislature. The State 20 Department of Education may utilize up to five percent of the appropriated funds to administer the provisions of this subdivision. The 21 State Department of Education may contract with a third-party vendor to 22 23 assist in carrying out this subdivision. The State Board of Education may 24 adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this subdivision. The rules and regulations shall include a formula or standard for 25 determining a cost-per-child allocation of funding based on the 26 Legislature's appropriation of funding. The rules and regulations shall 27 28 allow a designated agent, which may include a private school, to assist 29 the parents or quardians of a child in the request and acquisition of textbooks pursuant to this subdivision. It is the intent of the 30 31 Legislature that on or before October 1, 2028, and every five years

- 2 provide to the Education Committee of the Legislature recommended changes
- 3 to this subdivision that reflect advances in technology and educational
- 4 <u>content for students.</u>
- 5 For purposes of this section, textbook means any instructional
- 6 <u>material</u>, <u>including digital</u>, <u>electronic</u>, <u>or online resources</u>, <u>that is</u>
- 7 <u>designated for use by an individual student in classroom instruction as</u>
- 8 <u>the principal source of study material.</u>
