- 11 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.
- 12 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2025-26 and FY2026-27, the sums
- 13 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective
- 14 funds for the general operations of state government, postsecondary
- 15 education, state aid, capital construction projects, land acquisition,
- 16 lease-purchase arrangements, and major equipment acquisition, except as
- 17 otherwise appropriated.
- 18 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2025-26 to FY2026-27.
- 19 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are
- 20 hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances existing on
- 21 June 30, 2026, for FY2026-27, to the respective agencies, programs, and
- 22 funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided in this act.
- 23 **Sec. 4.** There are hereby reappropriated for each agency, program,
- 24 and fund for FY2025-26 and FY2026-27, any appropriation by the One
- 25 Hundred Seventh Legislature, First or Second Session, of the unexpended
- 26 and unencumbered appropriation balances of the Federal Funds allocated to

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- 1 the State of Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery
- 2 Fund pursuant to the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, 42 U.S.C.
- 3 802, as amended, unless otherwise indicated in this act and any other
- 4 legislative bill passed by the One Hundred Eighth Legislature, First or
- 5 Second Session. Such reappropriation shall retain any provided
- 6 limitations established by the appropriating legislative bill unless
- 7 otherwise indicated within this act and any other legislative bill passed
- 8 by the One Hundred Seventh Legislature, Second Session or the One Hundred
- 9 Eighth Legislature, First or Second Session.
- 10 Sec. 5. CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES.
- 11 All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2025, and June 30,
- 12 2026, not otherwise reappropriated pursuant to this act, are hereby
- 13 appropriated for FY2025-26 and FY2026-27, respectively, which amounts
- 14 shall be in addition to the amounts shown in this act.
- 15 Sec. 6. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.
- 16 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual,
- 17 and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature,
- 18 are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act,
- 19 except as provided in sections 9, 10, and 11 of this act.
- 20 Sec. 7. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.
- 21 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the
- 22 proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the
- 23 appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper
- 24 documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the
- 25 appropriate funds.
- 26 **Sec. 8.** BUDGET STATUS REPORTS.
- 27 All state agencies, boards, and commissions shall promptly establish
- 28 their detailed Budget Status Reports at the budget subprogram level in
- 29 the Nebraska Accounting System and adjust them as necessary during each
- 30 fiscal year to reflect the most current appropriations shown on the
- 31 Allotment Status Report.

- 1 Sec. 9. GIFTS.
- 2 Any gift shall be accepted in accordance with the State Acceptance
- 3 of Gifts Act. The definitions in the State Acceptance of Gifts Act are
- 4 hereby adopted by the Legislature for purposes of this act.
- 5 Any gift made available to the State of Nebraska for any purpose or
- 6 purposes, together with the income from such gift, shall be allocated to
- 7 the state agency designated by the donor or, if no state agency is
- 8 designated by the donor, shall be used in accordance with Article VII,
- 9 section 9, of the Constitution of Nebraska.
- 10 At the discretion of the budget administrator of the budget division
- 11 of the Department of Administrative Services and the Accounting
- 12 Administrator of the Department of Administrative Services, expenditures
- 13 of funds from any gift of money may be made through any existing or

- 25 Sec. 10. LIMITATION ON SALARIES, WAGES, AND PER DIEMS.
- 26 (1) For purposes of this act, (a) SALARY LIMIT shall mean total
- 27 expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems and (b)
- 28 total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems
- 29 shall mean all remuneration paid to employees treated as taxable
- 30 compensation by the Internal Revenue Service or subject to social
- 31 security coverage, specifically including payments accounted for as

- vacation, holidays, sick leave, military leave, funeral leave, maternity 1
- 2 leave, administrative leave, compensatory time, deferred compensation, or
- 3 any other similar form, and amounts withheld pursuant to law,
- excluding state contributions for social security, retirement, 4
- 5 employee insurance plans.
- 6 (2) Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per
- 7 diems shall be limited to the amount shown except when federal funds in
- 8 excess of the amount shown are available and approved by the Governor.
- 9 Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from such
- grants shall be in addition to the limitation on permanent and temporary 10
- 11 salaries and per diems otherwise shown in this act. No agency shall
- 12 request any state funds for continuation or replacement of any such
- personnel or activities in future budget requests. To the extent 13
- 14 feasible, requests for increases in the limitation on permanent and

- 15 Sec. 11. It is the intent of the Legislature that state agencies
- may, at their discretion, utilize employee furloughs as a short-term 16
- 17 means of addressing budgetary shortfalls. Furlough is defined as placing
- an employee in a temporary, nonduty, nonpay status because of the lack of 18
- funds. An intermittent furlough is a furlough action in which the 19
- 20 nonduty, nonpay status occurs discontinuously over a period of time
- 21 rather than consecutively. It is further intended that furloughs shall
- 22 not adversely affect the employee and employer health insurance premium
- 23 contributions and service anniversary date, nor shall leave earnings be
- 24 prorated as a result of the furlough.
