- Sec. 2. Section 79-1021, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 2
- 3 amended to read:
- 79-1021 (1) The Education Future Fund is created. The fund shall be 4
- 5 administered by the department and shall consist of money transferred to
- the fund by the Legislature. Transfers may be made from the Education 6
- 7 Future Fund to the Computer Science and Technology Education Fund at the
- direction of the Legislature. Any money in the Education Future Fund 8
- available for investment shall be invested by the state investment 9
- officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska 10
- State Funds Investment Act. 11
- (2) The fund shall be used only for the following purposes, in order 12
- 13 of priority:
- (a) To fully fund equalization aid under the Tax Equity and 14
- Educational Opportunities Support Act; 15
- (b) To fund reimbursements related to special education under 16
- section 79-1142; 17
- (c) To fund foundation aid under the Tax Equity and Educational 18
- Opportunities Support Act; 19
- 20 (d) To increase funding for school districts in a way that results
- 21 direct property tax relief, which means a dollar-for-dollar
- replacement of property taxes by a state funding source; 22
- (e) To provide funding for a grant program created by the 23
- Legislature to address teacher turnover rates and keep existing teachers 24
- in classrooms; 25
- (f) To provide funding to increase career and technical educational 26
- classroom opportunities for students, including, but not limited to, 27

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- computer science education. Such funding must provide students with the 1
- academic and technical skills, knowledge, and training necessary to 2
- 3 succeed in future careers;
- (g) To provide funding for a grant program created by the 4
- 5 Legislature to provide students the opportunity to have a mentor who will
- 6 continuously engage with the student directly to aid in the student's
- 7 professional growth and give ongoing support and encouragement to the
- 8 student;
- 9 (h) To provide funding for extraordinary increases in special
- education expenditures to allow school districts with large, unexpected 10
- 11 special education expenditures to more easily meet the needs of all
- 12 students;
- (i) To provide funding to help recruit teachers throughout the state 13
- 14 by utilizing apprenticeships through a teacher apprenticeship program and
- 15 an alternative certification process;
- (j) To provide funding to develop and implement a professional 16
- 17 learning system to help provide sustained professional learning and
- training regarding evidence-based reading instruction and for a grant 18
- program relating to dyslexia research; and 19
- 20 (k) To provide funding for a pilot project administered by the State
- 21 Department of Education to provide menstrual products to school
- 22 districts; and -
- 23 (1) To provide funding to carry out the Special Education Teacher
- 24 Forgivable Loan Program Act.
- (3)(a) The State Treasurer shall transfer one billion dollars from 25
- 26 the General Fund to the Education Future Fund in fiscal year 2023-24, on
- 27 such dates and in such amounts as directed by the budget administrator of
- the budget division of the Department of Administrative Services. 28
- 29 (b) The State Treasurer shall transfer two hundred fifty million
- 30 dollars from the General Fund to the Education Future Fund in fiscal year
- 2024-25, on such dates and in such amounts as directed by the budget 31

- 1 administrator of the budget division of the Department of Administrative
- 2 Services.
- 3 (c) It is the intent of the Legislature that two hundred fifty
- 4 million dollars be transferred from the General Fund to the Education
- 5 Future Fund in fiscal year 2025-26 and each fiscal year thereafter.
- 6 Sec. 3. Sections 3 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be cited
- 7 <u>as the Special Education Teacher Forgivable Loan Program Act.</u>
- 8 Sec. 4. (1) The Legislature finds that Nebraska elementary and
- 9 secondary schools have had difficulty filling open and necessary job
- 10 positions, including special education teachers.
- 11 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to assist individuals
- 12 studying to become special education teachers by supporting forgivable
- 13 loans to those individuals who commit to teaching in Nebraska following
- 14 their certification as a teacher with a special education endorsement.
- 15 **Sec. 5.** For purposes of the Special Education Teacher Forgivable
- 16 Loan Program Act:
- 17 (1) Department means the State Department of Education;
- 18 (2) Eligible institution means a not-for-profit college or
- 19 university that (a) is located in Nebraska, (b) is accredited by an
- 20 <u>accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of</u>
- 21 Education and determined to be acceptable by the State Board of
- 22 Education, and (c) has a special education teacher education program;
- 23 (3) Eligible noncitizen means an individual who:
- 24 (a) Is a United States national, including a native of American
- 25 <u>Samoa or Swains Island;</u>
- 26 (b) Is a lawful permanent resident with a Form I-551, I-151, or
- 27 <u>I-551C issued by the United States Government;</u>
- (c) Is a conditional permanent resident of the United States;
- 29 <u>(d) Has an Arrival-Departure Record I-94 from the United States</u>
- 30 <u>Citizenship and Immigration Services showing a status of Refugee, Asylum</u>
- 31 Granted, Parolee, Conditional Entrant, or Cuban-Haitian Entrant;

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- 1 (e) Holds a T nonimmigrant status visa or is a child of an
- 2 <u>individual who holds a T-1 nonimmigrant status visa;</u>
- 3 (f) Is a battered immigrant-qualified alien who is a victim of abuse
- 4 by such individual's spouse or parent who is a citizen or permanent
- 5 <u>resident;</u>
- 6 (g) Is a battered immigrant-qualified alien who is a child of a
- 7 person designated as such under the federal Violence Against Women Act;
- 8 <u>or</u>
- 9 (h) Is a citizen of the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the
- 10 Marshall Islands, or the Federated States of Micronesia;
- 11 (4) Eligible student means an individual who:
- 12 <u>(a) Is a United States citizen or an eligible noncitizen;</u>
- (b) Is a high school graduate or the equivalent of a high school
- 14 graduate;
- (c) Is enrolled in good standing at a state college in Nebraska or
- 16 the University of Nebraska;
- 17 <u>(d) Is seeking initial certification as a teacher with an</u>
- 18 <u>endorsement in special education; and</u>
- 19 <u>(e) Has applied for federal financial aid grants and state</u>
- 20 scholarships and grants to cover tuition and fees; and
- 21 (5) Teacher education program means a program of study that results
- 22 <u>in obtaining a bachelor's degree, master's degree, or special education</u>
- 23 <u>endorsement that meets the education requirements for certification</u>
- 24 <u>pursuant to sections 79-806 to 79-816.</u>
- 25 **Sec. 6.** (1) The Special Education Teacher Forgivable Loan Program
- 26 <u>is created and shall be administered by the department. The Education</u>
- 27 Future Fund shall be used to carry out the Special Education Teacher
- 28 Forgivable Loan Program Act.
- 29 (2) The department may award a forgivable loan to an eligible
- 30 student to pay for instate tuition, or the equivalent of instate tuition,
- 31 <u>at any eligible institution.</u>

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1 (3) The department may award up to twenty-five forgivable loans each

- 2 academic year for each eligible institution.
- 3 (4) An eligible student who is awarded a forgivable loan under the
- Special Education Teacher Forgivable Loan Program shall enter into a 4
- 5 contract with the department prior to the department dispersing any money
- for such loan. Such contract shall contain at least the following terms: 6
- 7 (a) The eligible student shall only be eligible to receive a loan
- 8 under the program for the first five years that the eligible student is
- 9 enrolled in a teacher education program;
- 10 (b) The loan shall only be used to pay for any tuition remaining due
- to the eligible institution attended by the eligible student after 11
- applying all awarded federal and state financial aid grants and 12
- 13 scholarships;
- 14 (c) The eligible student shall begin teaching special education at a
- 15 Nebraska elementary or secondary school within one year after graduating
- 16 with a degree in education; and
- 17 (d) The eligible student shall teach special education at a Nebraska
- elementary or secondary school for: 18
- 19 (i) Five consecutive years after graduating with a degree in
- 20 education; or
- 21 (ii) The equivalent number of years of loans taken.
- 22 (5)(a) When an eligible student who was awarded any forgivable loan
- 23 under this section graduates from an eligible institution, the department
- 24 shall determine the dollar amount of forgivable loans such student
- received each year and the overall total dollar amount of forgivable 25
- 26 <u>loans</u> paid to such eligible student.
- 27 (b)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (b)(ii) of this subsection,
- for each year after graduating from an eligible institution that an 28
- 29 eligible student complies with the terms of the contract under this
- 30 section, the department shall forgive twenty percent of the total dollar
- 31 amount of forgivable loans paid to such eligible student. After the fifth

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1 consecutive year of compliance with the terms of the contract, the

- 2 department shall notify the eligible student that the total amount of
- 3 forgivable loans provided under this section that were owed by such
- 4 eligible student are forgiven.
- 5 (ii) For an eligible student that received less than five total
- years of forgivable loans pursuant to this section, for each year after 6
- 7 graduating from an eligible institution that an eligible student complies
- 8 with the terms of the contract under this section, the department shall
- 9 forgive the amount of one year's worth of forgivable loans paid to such
- 10 eligible student. After the eligible student complies with the terms of
- 11 the contract for the number of years that the eligible student received a
- forgivable loan pursuant to this section, the department shall notify the 12
- 13 eligible student that the total amount of forgivable loans provided under
- 14 this section that were owed by such eligible student are forgiven.
- 15 (6) If an eligible student who accepted a forgivable loan under this
- 16 section fails to comply with the terms of the contract described in this
- section, such eligible student may receive a deferment from the 17
- obligation of repayment as specified in rules and regulations adopted and 18
- 19 promulgated under the Special Education Teacher Forgivable Loan Program
- 20 <u>Act.</u>
- 21 (7) Any eligible student who accepted a forgivable loan under this
- 22 section who fails to comply with the terms of the contract described in
- 23 this section and who does not receive a deferment from the obligation of
- 24 repayment as described in this section shall repay the remaining balance
- 25 of any forgivable loan with simple interest at a rate of five percent per
- 26 year. Any repayment under this section shall be remitted to the State
- 27 <u>Treasurer</u> for credit to the General Fund.
- 28 (8) The department shall provide each eligible student who accepts a
- 29 forgivable loan under this section with a description of the obligations
- 30 of such eligible student under the terms of the contract described in
- 31 this section.

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- Sec. 7. The State Board of Education may adopt and promulgate rules
- 2 <u>and regulations relating to the Special Education Teacher Forgivable Loan</u>
- 3 <u>Program Act.</u>
