- 11 and (ii) who is enrolled in an eligible program of study.

- 13 allocate funds appropriated to the board under the Nebraska Career
- 14 Scholarship Act between the state college campuses, determine the

- 17 directly to scholarship recipients during the fiscal year. Eligibility
- 18 criteria shall include being a first-time freshman or a transfer student
- 19 and enrollment in an eligible program of study.

- 22 (i) A program of study at a state college in rangeland management,
- 23 industrial technology, criminal justice, business administration,
- 24 education, communication, the Reserve Officers' Training Corps, or
- 25 computer information systems; and
- 26 (ii) Beginning with academic year 2024-25, a program of study

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- designated by the Department of Economic Development, in collaboration 1

- 3 periodic reviews of workforce needs in the state.

- 8 (d) The total number of scholarship recipients who graduated during 9 the immediately prior academic year and a comparison of the four-year graduation rates between the scholarship recipients who graduated and the 10 11 state college's overall four-year graduate rate reported to the 12 Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System for the same year; and
- (e) The number and percent of scholarship recipients who graduated 13 14 during the immediately prior calendar year who obtained employment in a 15 major-related field in the state.
- Sec. 4. Section 85-3004, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 16 17 amended to read:
- 85-3004 (1)(a) The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska 18 shall award a Nebraska Career Scholarship to any eligible university 19 student who is enrolled in an eligible program of study in an amount not 20 21 to exceed:
- 22 (i) Ten thousand dollars per year for any scholarship recipient who 23 is a transfer student; or
- 24 (ii) Except as provided in subdivision (1)(a)(i) of this section:
- (A) Twenty-five thousand dollars per year for any scholarship 25 26 recipient who achieved a composite score on a standard college admission 27 test equivalent to a score of at least twenty-eight out of a maximum score of thirty-six or an equivalent score on the SAT®; or 28

- 29 Postsecondary Education Data System for the same year; and
- 30 (e) The number and percent of scholarship recipients who graduated
- 31 during the immediately prior calendar year who obtained employment in a

- 3 amended to read:
- The Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary 4 85-3006 (1)(a)
- 5 Education, in collaboration with private colleges that elect to
- 6 participate, shall award a Nebraska Career Scholarship that does not
- 7 exceed a maximum of ten thousand dollars per year to any private college
- student who achieved a composite score on a standard college admission 8
- 9 test equivalent to a score of at least eighteen out of a maximum score of
- thirty-six or an equivalent score on the SAT® or who had a high school 10
- 11 grade-point average of 3.0 or greater on a four-point scale and who is

- 8 $\underline{\text{(d)}}$ (e) The total number of graduates for the immediately prior
- 9 academic year, the number of scholarship recipient graduates for such
- 10 academic year, and a comparison of the graduation rates for scholarship
- 11 recipients and nonscholarship students; and
- 12 <u>(e) Using data from the Department of Labor, the</u> (f) The number of
- 13 scholarship recipients obtaining employment in the state within five
- 14 <u>fiscal quarters after completion of an eligible program of study</u>
- 15 graduates from the immediately prior academic year who obtained
- 16 employment in a major-related field in the state within four months after
- 17 graduation and the average starting salary for such graduates.
- 18 (6) (7) The Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education
- 19 shall allocate the amount appropriated to the commission to carry out
- 20 this section to private colleges that elect to participate under the

- 23 **Sec. 6.** (1) For purposes of this section:
- 24 (a) Contract means any agreement between a covered institution and a
- 25 foreign adversarial source for the acquisition by purchase, lease, or
- 26 <u>barter of property or services, for the direct benefit or use of either</u>
- 27 of the parties;
- 28 (b) Covered institution means any public or private two-year or
- 29 <u>four-year college or university having a campus or place of business in</u>
- 30 <u>Nebraska;</u>
- 31 <u>(c) Foreign adversarial source means:</u>

- 1 (i) A foreign adversary government, including an agency of a foreign
- 2 <u>adversary government;</u>
- 3 (ii) A legal entity, governmental or otherwise, created solely under
- 4 <u>laws of a foreign adversary government;</u>
- 5 <u>(iii) An individual who is a citizen or a national of a foreign</u>
- 6 <u>adversary government; and</u>
- 7 (iv) An agent of any entity or individual described in subdivision
- 8 (1)(c)(i), (ii), or (iii) of this section, including a subsidiary or
- 9 affiliate of a foreign adversary legal entity acting on behalf of any
- 10 such entity or individual;
- 11 <u>(d) Foreign adversary means a foreign adversary as determined</u>
- 12 pursuant to 15 C.F.R. 791.4, as such regulation existed on January 1,
- 13 2025; and
- 14 (e) Reportable funding means revenue or the fair-market value of
- 15 anything received as the result of any contract, gift, grant, endowment,
- 16 award, scholarship, or donation, including a conditional or unconditional
- 17 pledge of a contract, gift, grant, endowment, award, scholarship, or
- 18 <u>donation from a foreign adversarial source.</u>
- 19 (2)(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b) of this subsection,
- 20 <u>each covered institution shall provide a report biannually to the</u>
- 21 <u>Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education, in a manner</u>
- 22 prescribed by the commission, detailing all reportable funding received
- 23 by the covered institution. Unless the information is exempt or
- 24 prohibited from disclosure or deemed confidential under federal or state
- 25 law, the report shall include the following information:
- 26 (i) The amount of the reportable funding and the date that such
- 27 <u>funding was received;</u>
- 28 (ii) A description of the type of reportable funding and the purpose
- 29 for such funding, including whether the reportable funding is part of an
- 30 ongoing relationship with the foreign adversarial source;
- 31 (iii) A detailed description of the foreign adversarial source

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- 1 providing the reportable funding, including the name of the foreign
- 2 <u>adversarial source and, if not a foreign government, the country of</u>
- 3 citizenship, if known, and the country of principal residence or domicile
- 4 <u>of the foreign adversarial source; and</u>
- 5 (iv) A copy of any contract, agreement, pledge, or memorandum of
- 6 <u>understanding associated with the funding.</u>
- 7 (b) This section shall not require reporting of payments made to a
- 8 covered institution by a natural person who would otherwise qualify as a
- 9 foreign adversarial source for tuition or related fees to support an
- 10 <u>individual enrolled or planning to attend a covered institution.</u>
- 11 (c) The Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education shall
- 12 post the report on its public website.
- 13 Sec. 7. Section 6 of this act becomes operative on July 1, 2025.
- 14 Sections 3, 4, 5, and 8 of this act become operative three calendar
- 15 months after the adjournment of this legislative session. The other
- 16 sections of this act become operative on their effective date.
- 17 **Sec. 8.** Original sections 85-3003, 85-3004, and 85-3006, Reissue
- 18 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
