- 3 Section 1. Section 81-2601, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 4 amended to read:
- 5 81-2601 (1) There is hereby established the Commission on African
- 6 American Affairs. For purposes of sections 81-2601 to 81-2607, commission
- 7 means the Commission on African American Affairs.
- 8 (2) The commission shall consist of fourteen members who shall be of
- 9 African ancestry. Members of the commission shall be appointed by the
- 10 Governor. One member of the commission shall, at the time of initial
- 11 appointment, be an individual who identifies as an immigrant or new
- 12 American, and one member shall, at the time of initial appointment, be a
- 13 young professional eighteen years of age or older and younger than
- 14 twenty-five years of age. The commission may have such nonvoting, ex
- 15 officio members as shall be appointed by the commission and who need not
- 16 be of African ancestry. The commission shall elect one of its members as
- 17 chairperson.
- 18 (3) Members of the commission shall serve no more than two full,
- 19 four-year terms or for the unexpired term in the event of a vacancy. As
- 20 the terms of the voting members expire, their successors shall be
- 21 appointed by the Governor from a panel of nominees submitted by the
- 22 public. An appointment for an unexpired term shall follow the same
- 23 procedure as for initial and subsequent appointments. Voting members
- 24 shall be eligible for reappointment.
- 25 (4) The names of all commissioners shall be listed on the
- 26 commission's website.

- 8 **Sec. 3.** Section 81-2603, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 9 amended to read:
- 10 81-2603 The commission may receive and administer funds from state,
- 11 federal, and other sources and may employ and fix the compensation of
- 12 <u>personnel</u> an executive director of its own choosing who shall be an
- 13 African American person and a legal resident of the State of Nebraska. An
- 14 office for the executive <u>management</u> director shall be provided.

- 17 81-2604 The functions of the commission are to:
- 18 (1) Promote state and federal legislation beneficial to the African
- 19 American community in Nebraska;
- 20 (2) Coordinate <u>new and existing programs</u> relating to the African
- 21 American community in Nebraska regarding key opportunities including, but
- 22 <u>not limited to, housing</u>, education, welfare, medical and dental care,
- 23 employment, economic development, law and order, and related themes
- 24 problems;
- 25 (3) Work with other state and federal government agencies and
- 26 federal and state elected officials in the development of programs in
- 27 areas mentioned in subdivision (2) of this section;
- 28 (4) Keep the Governor's office apprised of the situation in the
- 29 African American community in Nebraska;
- 30 (5) Administer sections 81-2601 to 81-2607;

- 8 <u>one of such meetings</u> once every calendar <u>year shall be in the city in</u>
- 9 Nebraska with the largest African American population. In addition to the
- 10 requirements of the Open Meetings Act, public notice of a meeting shall
- 11 <u>be required no later than seven calendar days prior to the date of such</u>
- 12 meeting and shall be published on the commission's website and social
- 13 media and shared with local media outlets quarter. Meetings shall be held
- 14 in January, April, July, and October. Special meetings may be called at
- 15 the request of eight voting members. Eight voting members of the
- 16 commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 17 <u>Commission meeting minutes shall be posted on the commission's website.</u>
- 18 (2) The office of any member of the commission who, without a valid
- 19 excuse, fails to attend annual quarterly or special meetings shall be

- 24 (a) An overview of the commission's mission, key achievements,

- 28 which the commission advocated, supported, or implemented that impacted
- 29 <u>the African American community, and the progress made on the policies</u>
- 30 <u>described in sections 81-2601 to 81-2607;</u>
- 31 (c) Community engagement programs including initiatives, outreach,

- 1 public forums, and partnerships with community organizations;
- 2 (d) Economic development initiatives including efforts to improve
- 3 economic opportunities within the African American community, employment
- 4 programs, small business support, training, and progress in reducing
- 5 <u>economic disparities;</u>
- 6 (e) Education and workforce development including educational
- 7 initiatives, such as scholarships, mentoring programs, partnerships with
- 8 schools, and efforts to ensure African American youth and adults have
- 9 access to career advancement opportunities;
- 10 <u>(f) Health and wellness initiatives including programs that address</u>
- 11 <u>health disparities, wellness promotion, and increasing access to health</u>
- 12 <u>care resources;</u>
- 13 (g) Criminal justice and public safety efforts including those that
- 14 <u>address disparities in the criminal justice system, programs for formerly</u>
- 15 incarcerated individuals, and improvements in police-community relations;
- 16 (h) Housing and community development including initiatives to
- 17 <u>address issues such as affordable housing, eviction prevention efforts,</u>
- 18 and partnerships with housing agencies;
- 19 (i) Metrics and key performance indicators including data that
- 20 <u>demonstrates the impact of each program or initiative, such as employment</u>
- 21 <u>rates, graduation rates, health outcomes, and recidivism rates in the</u>
