(1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, a licensed professional midwife may practice professional midwifery at any location other than a hospital as defined in section 71-419 and shall not be required to practice under the supervision of or under a collaborative practice agreement with another health care provider. (2) In order to be permitted to practice professional midwifery in a health care practitioner facility as defined in section 71-414 or a

10 <u>midwife shall be subject to the rules and procedures of the facility</u>

Sec. 37. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of section 34 of this act, nothing in the Licensed Professional Midwives Practice Act shall abridge, limit, or change in any way the right of parents to deliver their baby where, when, how, and with whom they choose, regardless of credentialed status.
