- 23 (2) Occupational therapy encompasses evaluation, treatment, and
- 24 consultation and may include (a) remediation or restoration of
- 25 performance abilities that are limited due to impairment in biological,
- 26 physiological, psychological, or neurological processes, (b) adaptation
- 27 of task, process, or the environment, or the teaching of compensatory
- 28 techniques, in order to enhance performance, (c) disability prevention
- 29 methods and techniques which facilitate the development or safe
- 30 application of performance skills, and (d) health promotion strategies
- 31 and practices which enhance performance abilities.

- 19 electrotherapeutic modalities, and mechanical devices if the occupational
- 20 therapy assistant has successfully completed a training course approved
- 21 by the board and passed an examination approved by the board. Such set up
- 22 and implementation shall only be done under the onsite supervision of an
- 23 occupational therapist certified to administer such modalities
- 24 superficial thermal agent modalities.

- 26 reevaluation, treatment planning, and treatment goals for physical agent
- 27 modalities to an occupational therapy assistant.

- 31 Sec. 23. Supervision means a collaborative process for responsible,

- periodic review and inspection of all aspects of occupational therapy 1
- services where (1) the occupational therapist is responsible for 2
- 3 occupational therapy services provided by an occupational therapy
- assistant or an occupational therapy aide, and (2) an occupational 4
- 5 therapy assistant is responsible for the occupational therapy services
- 6 provided by the assistant. The goal of supervision is to ensure the safe
- 7 and effective delivery of occupational therapy services.
