Methodology

Survey Purpose

This survey measured how competitively Nebraska state government 2025 salaries aligned with prevailing local labor-market wages. The State Personnel Division conducted this analysis as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 81-1307.01, 81-1307.02, and 81-1376. State government pay ranges excluded those of state colleges and the University of Nebraska system which are administered separately and thus beyond the scope of this report.



Scope

State Personnel used 61 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) definitions as benchmarks to compare state government employee wages with Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) data (U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics [BLS], 2026). For each job classification, an analyst calculated average, minimum, median, and maximum hourly base wages. These state wage figures and employee counts were then matched to corresponding occupations and OEWS estimates.

To produce the OEWS estimates, the Nebraska Department of Labor (NDOL) OEWS Unit, in coordination with the BLS, surveyed roughly three percent of nonfarm business establishments, excluding self-employed individuals. The unit conducted these surveys twice each year and also compiled an annual census of executive-branch establishments in federal and state governments and the U.S. Postal Service. Each November, wage information from the State of Nebraska was collected as part of this process. Following BLS procedures, the resulting OEWS estimates were based on three years of survey and census responses to increase sample size and improve statistical reliability (BLS, 2026).

This study was based on OEWS data released on May 15, 2026, which provided Nebraska employment and wage estimates by occupation, industry group, and geographic area. The dataset incorporated six survey panels collected from November 2022 through May 2025. Before release, wage estimates were adjusted to first-quarter 2026 levels using a statistical model that applied national Employment Cost Index (ECI) factors (NDOL, 2026).

Industry Groups

The OEWS Unit categorized responding business establishments by industries based on the 2022 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) (U.S. Census Bureau, 2022). For this study, wage and employment estimates were analyzed across two industry groupings:

- **All Industries:** Modeled (statistically estimated) data for all business establishments covered by unemployment insurance laws in Nebraska.
- **Public Administration Sector (OEWS-defined):** Modeled (statistically estimated) data for federal, state, and local government establishments in Nebraska with the following exceptions that are classified in other sectors: public schools, hospitals, transportation facilities, utilities, and the Government Printing Office.

Analyzing wages against both industry groups presented different lenses to evaluate state salaries. Comparing wages to employers from all industries provided a look at how government pay compares to the broader labor market. This was beneficial for occupations in which the State competes for talent across industries. Estimates from the Public Administration Sector showed how State employee salaries compared to all in-state public sector employees.

Government work units frequently fall within the Public Administration sector. However, classification is based on function rather than ownership. When government-owned establishments performed work comparable to private businesses, like the exceptions listed above for the Public Administration Sector, they were instead categorized in those corresponding NAICS industries. (See the Exceptions & Confidentiality section on page 10 regarding educational occupations).

To highlight labor market differences across areas, results for both industry groups were published for three geographic areas: statewide, metropolitan, and non-metropolitan.



Metro and Non-Metro Area Definitions

The OEWS Unit filtered the dataset by geographic area, grouping results into statewide, metropolitan (metro), and non-metropolitan (non-metro) regions based on BLS 2023 definitions. The Sioux City area was counted as a metropolitan area in those descriptions (BLS, 2023).

- **Statewide** data included estimates for the entire state of Nebraska.
- **Metropolitan (Metro) Areas** consisted of aggregated results from Nebraska counties within all Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs): Grand Island, Lincoln, Omaha, and Sioux City.
- **Non-metropolitan (Non-metro) Areas** included pooled results from all counties outside the metro areas listed below (see gold box).

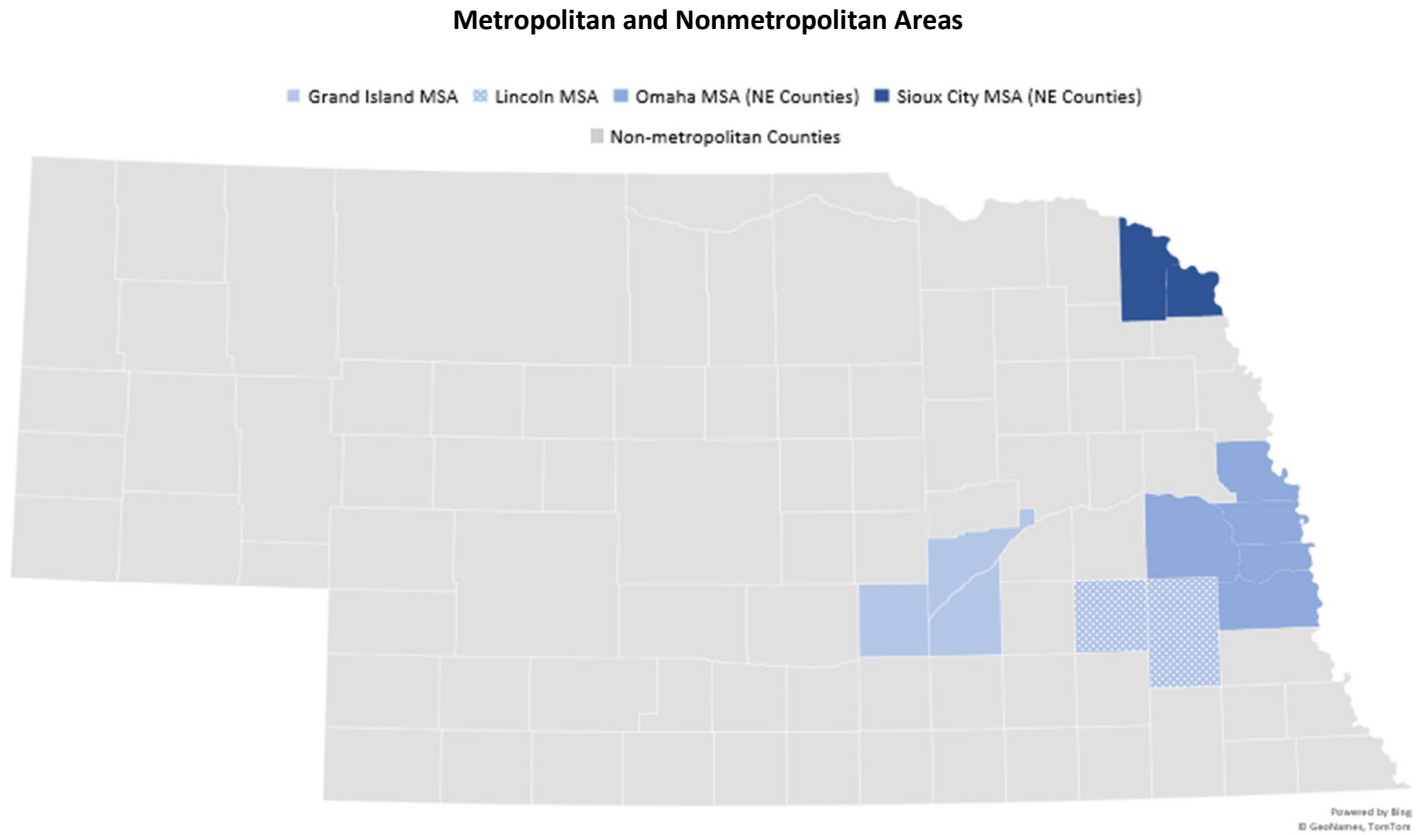

Procedure

The Nebraska Department of Administrative Services aligned state job classifications with 61 occupational benchmarks using published job specifications. The state government pay plan published in July 2025 and the employee data from May 2026 were compared with Nebraska OEWS wage and staffing estimates for the first quarter of 2026.

State Personnel extracted employee wage data from the human resource information system. More than 200 state job codes were matched to SOC codes and their corresponding OEWS estimates. This analysis included both classifications covered by the State Personnel Rules and those covered by labor contracts.

For each benchmark occupation, the survey displayed the SOC code, occupational title, and SOC system definition. When available, examples of nationally matched job titles from the O*NET website were included (National Center for O*NET Development, n.d.). The survey provided the following wage and staffing estimates:

- **Staffing:** A statistically estimated staffing level for the occupation, industry, and geographic area.
- **Average Wage:** The mean hourly wage across all establishments within the defined industry and area.
- **10th Percentile:** The wage at which 10% of employees earn that amount or less, while 90% earn that amount or more.
- **50th Percentile (Median Wage):** The wage at which 50% of employees earn that amount or less and 50% earn that amount or more.
- **90th Percentile:** The wage at which 90% of employees earn that amount or less, while 10% earn that amount or more.

Both average and median wages were included to assess whether average wages skewed higher or lower within the sampled dataset. State job classification data were aligned with OEWS employment and wage estimates as shown below:

Exceptions & Confidentiality

Wage results were presented as hourly rates for all occupations except SOC codes **25-2031 (secondary teachers)** and **11-9032 (school administrators)**. The OEWS published these two occupations exclusively with annual salaries because the number of contract days differed among positions. These occupations also appeared only in the Educational Services Sector rather than in Public Administration.

The BLS determined whether OEWS data could be published for each occupation and geographic level to maintain confidentiality and comply with the Confidential Information Protection and Statistical Efficiency Act (CIPSEA). When sample sizes were too small or when a single employer accounted for more than 80% of an industry, the BLS suppressed the data or aggregated it to a broader level (BLS, 2025). State Personnel reported actual employee average and median wages for three or more incumbents in a job class.

Interpreting Data Tables

OEWS data comparisons were displayed across industry groups and within statewide, metro, and non-metro areas of Nebraska. Note that the OEWS statewide staffing estimates did not always equal the sum of the metro and non-metro estimates. Such discrepancies may have resulted from sampling methods, exclusion criteria, or statistical adjustments applied to the data. In addition, some business establishments indicated they operated across Nebraska without specifying a county location. According to the OEWS *Handbook of Methods*, these businesses were “used in the calculation of the statewide and national estimates” but were excluded from substate estimates (BLS, 2021).

Wage and staffing estimates for occupations were presented alongside state employment and wage data for selected SOC system benchmarks, as was shown in the table above. In some cases, multiple job classes were presented for comparison across job levels and employee groups. The first character of each state job code indicated whether the classification was covered by the State Personnel Rules (unorganized) or by a labor contract (organized). The table below shows which letters corresponded to each group.

Appendix: State of Nebraska Salary and Classification System Excerpts

SALARY SYSTEM Revised 06-21-2021

Compensation plans for Classified System Employees are established on a “Pay by Class” system.

Compensation plans for Non-Classified System Employees are established by each non-classified agency head.

CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM

Classification Codes: The alphabetical prefix of the class codes indicates to which bargaining group the classification belongs, and which salary schedule must be used.

Assignment of Class Codes: The Director of the State Personnel Division of Administrative Services shall assign all class codes to all classification titles used throughout state government, excluding the University of Nebraska.

Explanation of Class Code: The class code provides a system of numbering, using a predetermined formula. The class code consists of a five-digit number with an alphabetical prefix.

EXAMPLE:

A 19 61 1

A Coverage Indicator

19 Broad Occupational Category

61 Serial Number – identifies specific classifications within a broad occupational category

1 Skill Level – identifies the level of classification (for example, the Food Service Assistant and Food Service Worker and classes). Those classes with only one level have a skill level designated as “0”.

A = Administrative Professional Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of professional employees with general business responsibilities, including accountants, buyers, personnel specialists, information technology personnel and similar classes.

C = Social Services and Counseling Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of generally professional-level workers providing services and benefits to eligible persons. Classes include job service personnel, economic assistance personnel, social workers, counselors and similar classes.

D = Doctors

Is composed of medical professionals such as doctors, psychiatrists, physician assistants and nurse practitioners.

E = Engineering, Science and Resources Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of professional scientific occupations, including civil and other engineers, architects, chemists, geologists, surveyors and similar classes.

G = Management Non-Contract Group

Is composed of jobs performing senior policy making and higher level managerial/administrative functions essential to the overall mission of the agency, board or commission.

H = Health and Human Care Professional Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of community health, nutrition and health service professional employees, including nurses, psychologists, pharmacists, dietitians, licensed therapists and similar classes.

I = Health and Human Care Non-Professional Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of institutional care classes, including nurse aides, psychiatric aides, therapy aides and similar classes.

K = Confidential Non-Contract Group

Is composed of specific positions at any occupational level which handle information or provide advice pertinent to the development, negotiation and/or interpretation/application of labor contracts, or issues related to such agreements, including human resource administrators, personnel managers/specialists and similar jobs.

L = Law Enforcement Bargaining Unit²

Is composed of employees holding powers of arrest, including Nebraska State Patrol officers and sergeants, conservation officers, fire marshal deputies and similar classes.

M = Maintenance, Trades and Technical Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of generally recognized blue collar and technical classes, including highway maintenance workers, carpenters, plumbers, electricians, print shop workers, auto mechanics, engineering aides and associates and similar classes.

N = Non-Classified Service Group

Is used by agencies for positions not covered by the State Personnel Salary System.

P = Protective Services Bargaining Unit⁴

Is composed of institutional security guard personnel, including correctional officers, building security guards and similar classes.

R = Temporary Non-Contract Group

Is composed of positions and job classes staffed by employees who are hired for a limited period of time and are not working on an on-going and continuous basis.

S = Administrative Support Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of clerical and administrative non-professional classes, including typists, secretaries, accounting clerks, computer operators, office service personnel and similar classes.

T = Teachers Association³

Is composed of employees/classes which are required to be licensed or certified as a teacher in the state of Nebraska.

V = Supervisory Non-Contract Group

Is composed of employees who are supervisors as defined in Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 48-801.

W = Rules-Covered Classes Not Fitting Into Any Other Bargaining Group

Is composed of positions and job classes which are not appropriately assigned to one of the units or categories described above. Currently, only the State Patrol Officer Candidate class is assigned to this group.

X = Examining, Inspection and Licensing Bargaining Unit¹

Is composed of positions empowered to review certain public and business activities, including driver-licensing personnel, revenue agents, bank and insurance examiners who remain in the State Personnel system under sections 8-105 and 44-119, various public health and protection inspectors and similar classes.

Z = Miscellaneous Non-Classified Group

Is composed of miscellaneous non-classified positions/employees that are not eligible for any benefits.
