Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 133 amends § 28-1008 to add "animal control officer" to the definition of "law enforcement officer" for purposes of animal control laws. This change gives animal control officers authority to enforce state or local animal control laws if authorized by a city, village, or county. The bill contains an emergency clause.

Explanation of amendments:

The Judiciary Committee Amendment, AM 251, adds a separate definition for "animal control officer" and includes "animal control officer" where "law enforcement officer" is used in sections 28-1012, 28-1012.01, and 28-1019, to allow both animal control officers and law enforcement officers to swear to warrants, conduct investigations, issue citations, and seize animals under animal control laws.
