Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill proposes elimination of special elections for school bonds. Ballot questions on such bond issues would instead be posed to voters during the regularly scheduled statewide primary or general elections held in even-numbered years or, where applicable, during the regularly scheduled general elections of political subdivisions during odd-numbered years. Section 6 of the bill contains the new operative language governing the conduct of such bond elections.

Explanation of amendments:

The committee amendment provides for an additional opportunity for an election during each odd-numbered year, even in communities that do not have municipal elections on that cycle.
