Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 140 requires school districts to adopt a policy regulating student use of electronic communication devices (such as cell phones) on school property or at school functions by the 2025-26 school year. The policy must be created with

input from students, parents, and educators and may include rules on discipline and enforcement. However, it cannot prevent device use in certain situations, such as when required by a student's Individualized Education Program or 504 plan, when authorized by a teacher for educational purposes, during emergencies, for healthcare management, or when deemed appropriate by school authorities. The bill includes an emergency clause.

Explanation of amendments:

AM 203 amends LB 140 as follows: on page 2, lines 10 and 16, it inserts the word "instructional" after the second word "school." In line 18, "cell phones" is replaced with "electronic communication devices." In line 23, it inserts "instructional" after "school." In line 29, "a teacher" is replaced with "the school district." Additionally, on page 3, line 6, the word "communicating" is replaced with "communication."

These changes ensure that the bill applies to all electronic devices, not just cell phones. Additionally, the restrictions are limited to instructional school functions, and the authority to authorize device use for educational purposes rests with the school district, not individual teachers.
