## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 168 would create the 340B Contract Pharmacy Protection Act (Act). The Act would prohibit any manufacturer, agent or affiliate of such manufacturer, or distributor or third-party logistics provider of such manufacturer's drugs from



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denying, restricting, or prohibiting the acquisition of any 340B drug by, or delivery of any 340B drug to, any location authorized by any 340B entity to receive such 340B drug. The Act would also prevent those same parties from requiring 340B entities to submit data as a condition for allowing the acquisition of 340B drugs.

The Act also grants the Attorney General's Office or any county attorney enforcement authority.

The Act states that nothing in the Act shall be construed or applied to conflict with federal law or any other law of the State of Nebraska, if such law is compatible with applicable federal law.

The Bill has a severability clause and an emergency clause.

Explanation of amendments:  AM 225 removes the restrictions on distributors of 340B drugs.
