Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would create a new section of statute providing for paid maternity leave for state employees. State employees would be entitled to twelve weeks of paid maternity leave. Such leave could commence no earlier than the date of birth and could not be used more than six months after such birth. Thirty days notice would be required from employees intending to take maternity leave unless such notice is not practicable. Intermittent usage would be prohibited unless that usage is either agreed upon by the state and employee or certified as medically necessary by the employee's health care provider. The maternity leave would not be charged against the employee's accumulating sick or vacation leave. Upon return, the employee would be entitled to either resume her previous position or to be placed in a position with similar status, seniority, pay, and benefits. Employees using this leave would be protected from employer retaliation.
