Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

The intent of LB 608 is to expand the Firsts Responder Recruitment and Retention Act (the Act) to add officers, jail employees, youth detention facility workers, and their qualified dependents into the Act's existing tuition waiver program. Also included are former employees of, and dependents of, these categories who became physically or mentally disabled while employed in those capacities. Groups added via AM 904 would only be eligible for 100% waiver when attending the University of Nebraska (NU) and once eligibility criteria have been met. With AM 904, NU would be reimbursed for up to 50% of waivers after July 1, 2026 and after course completion requirements have been verified. The reimbursements are not applicable to first responders covered under the Act prior to LB 608.

AM 1347 delays the effective date of these new waivers from July 1, 2025, to July 1, 2027; harmonizes requirements that must be met to be eligible for the waiver, and provides clarifying language with regards to disabilities.

As such, the fiscal impacts calculated for AM 904 remain the best estimates currently available for the FY27-FY28 biennium, but could be further adjusted based on tuition price changes and other factors. The chart below reflects NU projections at current tuition rates, but excludes any potential (though unintended) impact to the State College system (NSCS). They also exclude the cost of tuition waivers that were already in place at NU and NSCS prior to LB 608, for which no state funding for reimbursement has been appropriated. Impact to community colleges would be minimal.

#### **Explanation of Estimate:**

AM 1347 delays certain tuition waivers identified in AM 904 to begin July 1, 2027. This means there is no fiscal impact for FY26 and FY27. Our calculation of the fiscal impact below is still valid beginning FY27 and could be higher for any future tuition increases in FY27 and beyond.

The following paragraphs were provided earlier for AM 904 and are included for reference.

AM 904 creates a category for disabled professional law enforcement officers and professional firefighters, and their dependents, that make them eligible for tuition waivers at the University of Nebraska, state colleges, and community colleges, increasing our financial burden. The definition of 'disability' is broad, encompassing anyone who can no longer perform their duties due to injury or illness, regardless of whether it occurred on the job, happened years ago, or is a permanent disability. The fiscal impact for FY26 and FY27 is detailed below, assuming a 5% tuition increase for both years. The impact over four academic years to the state colleges would be approximately \$22,000-25,000.

The amendment also expands tuition waivers to correction officers, jail employees, and youth detention officers, including those that are disabled, and their dependents. Based on the draft language in the amended legislation, the tuition waiver for this group of individuals has been limited to the University of Nebraska. We believe there is some conflicting language within the bill regarding whether the state colleges and community colleges would be included in the tuition waiver for this group of individuals. However, we have decided not to calculate the fiscal impact, in part based on the floor debate when AM 904 was discussed which seemed to affirm the intent to exclude the state colleges and community colleges from the tuition waiver.

### **Explanation of Estimate:**

The proposed amendment to the First Responder Recruitment and Retention Act effectively delays the implementation of tuition waivers for eligible first responders and their dependents until the next biennium. For the current biennium, there will be no fiscal impact on the state budget, as the implementation of the program will not begin until the subsequent biennium. Future costs upon implementation may vary depending on participation levels, tuition price changes, and further projections.
