- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Controlled Substances Act; to
- 2 amend section 28-470, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2024;
- 3 to provide for immunity for conduct relating to opioid overdose
- 4 reversal medications; to provide and eliminate definitions; and to
- 5 repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- **Section 1.** Section 28-470, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2024, is amended to read:
- 3 28-470 (1) A health professional who is authorized to prescribe or
- 4 dispense an opioid overdose reversal medication naloxone, if acting with
- 5 reasonable care, may prescribe, administer, or dispense <u>such medication</u>
- 6 naloxone to any of the following persons without being subject to
- 7 administrative action or criminal prosecution:
- 8 (a) A person who is apparently experiencing or who is likely to
- 9 experience an opioid-related overdose; or
- 10 (b) A family member, friend, or other person in a position to assist
- 11 a person who is apparently experiencing or who is likely to experience an
- 12 opioid-related overdose.
- 13 (2) A family member, friend, or <u>any</u>other person, including school
- 14 personnel, who is in a position to assist a person who is apparently
- 15 experiencing or who is likely to experience an opioid-related overdose,
- 16 other than an emergency responder or peace officer, is not subject to
- 17 actions under the Uniform Credentialing Act, administrative action, or
- 18 criminal prosecution if the person, acting in good faith:
- 19 (a) Obtains an opioid overdose reversal medication , obtains
- 20 naloxone from a health professional, pursuant to or a prescription, or
- 21 over the counter; for naloxone from a health professional and
- 22 (b) Administers such medication administers the naloxone obtained
- 23 from the health professional or acquired pursuant to the prescription to
- 24 a person who is apparently experiencing an opioid-related overdose.
- 25 (3) An emergency responder who, acting in good faith, obtains an
- 26 <u>opioid overdose reversal medication</u> naloxone from the emergency
- 27 responder's emergency medical service organization and administers such
- 28 <u>medication</u> the naloxone to a person who is apparently experiencing an
- 29 opioid-related overdose shall not be:
- 30 (a) Subject to administrative action or criminal prosecution; or
- 31 (b) Personally liable in any civil action to respond in damages as a

- 1 result of his or her acts of commission or omission arising out of and in
- 2 the course of his or her rendering such care or services or arising out
- 3 of his or her failure to act to provide or arrange for further medical
- 4 treatment or care for the person who is apparently experiencing an
- 5 opioid-related overdose, unless the emergency responder caused damage or
- 6 injury by his or her willful, wanton, or grossly negligent act of
- 7 commission or omission. This subdivision shall not affect the liability
- 8 of such emergency medical service organization for the emergency
- 9 responder's acts of commission or omission.
- 10 (4) A peace officer or law enforcement employee who, acting in good
- 11 faith, obtains an opioid overdose reversal medication naloxone from the
- 12 peace officer's or employee's law enforcement agency and administers such
- 13 <u>medication</u> the naloxone to a person who is apparently experiencing an
- 14 opioid-related overdose shall not be:
- (a) Subject to administrative action or criminal prosecution; or
- 16 (b) Personally liable in any civil action to respond in damages as a
- 17 result of his or her acts of commission or omission arising out of and in
- 18 the course of his or her rendering such care or services or arising out
- 19 of his or her failure to act to provide or arrange for further medical
- 20 treatment or care for the person who is apparently experiencing an
- 21 opioid-related overdose, unless the peace officer or employee caused
- 22 damage or injury by his or her willful, wanton, or grossly negligent act
- 23 of commission or omission. This subdivision shall not affect the
- 24 liability of such law enforcement agency for the peace officer's or
- 25 employee's acts of commission or omission.
- 26 (5) For purposes of this section:
- 27 (a) Administer has the same meaning as in section 38-2806;
- 28 (b) Dispense has the same meaning as in section 38-2817;
- 29 (c) Emergency responder means an emergency medical responder, an
- 30 emergency medical technician, an advanced emergency medical technician,
- 31 or a paramedic licensed under the Emergency Medical Services Practice Act

- 1 or practicing pursuant to the EMS Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact;
- 2 (d) Health professional means a physician, physician assistant,
- 3 nurse practitioner, or pharmacist licensed under the Uniform
- 4 Credentialing Act;
- 5 (e) Law enforcement agency means a police department, a town
- 6 marshal, the office of sheriff, or the Nebraska State Patrol;
- 7 (f) Law enforcement employee means an employee of a law enforcement
- 8 agency, a contractor of a law enforcement agency, or an employee of such
- 9 contractor who regularly, as part of his or her duties, handles,
- 10 processes, or is likely to come into contact with any evidence or
- 11 property which may include or contain opioids;
- 12 (g) Opioid overdose reversal medication means any lifesaving
- 13 <u>medication approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for</u>
- 14 reversing an opioid overdose, whether obtained by prescription, from a
- 15 health professional, or over the counter, and includes, but is not
- 16 limited to, naloxone and nalmefene Naloxone means naloxone hydrochloride;

- 18 (h) Peace officer has the same meaning as in section 49-801.
