A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to state intent; to define 1 terms; to make appropriations for the expenses of Nebraska State 2 Government for the biennium ending June 30, 2027; to appropriate 3 funds allocated to the State of Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant to the federal 5 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, 42 U.S.C. 802, as amended; to 6 7 appropriate funds for capital construction and property acquisition 8 as prescribed; to require program statements and a request for 9 funding; to transfer funds; to provide duties; to provide an 10 operative date; and to declare an emergency.

11 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.
- 2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by
- 3 the One Hundred Ninth Legislature, First or Second Session, which
- 4 appropriates funds, FY2024-25 means the period July 1, 2024, through June
- 5 30, 2025; FY2025-26 means the period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026;
- 6 FY2026-27 means the period July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027; FY2027-28
- 7 means the period July 1, 2027, through June 30, 2028; and FY2028-29 means
- 8 the period July 1, 2028, through June 30, 2029.
- 9 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.
- 10 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2025-26 and FY2026-27, the sums
- 11 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective
- 12 funds for the general operations of state government, postsecondary
- 13 education, state aid, capital construction projects, land acquisition,
- 14 lease-purchase arrangements, and major equipment acquisition, except as
- 15 otherwise appropriated.
- Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2025-26 to FY2026-27.
- 17 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are
- 18 hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances existing on
- 19 June 30, 2026, for FY2026-27, to the respective agencies, programs, and
- 20 funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided in this act.
- 21 Sec. 4. There are hereby reappropriated for each agency, program,
- 22 and fund for FY2025-26 and FY2026-27, any appropriation by the One
- 23 Hundred Seventh Legislature, First or Second Session, of the unexpended
- 24 and unencumbered appropriation balances of the Federal Funds allocated to
- 25 the State of Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery
- 26 Fund pursuant to the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, 42 U.S.C.
- 27 802, as amended, unless otherwise indicated in this act and any other
- 28 legislative bill passed by the One Hundred Eighth Legislature, First or
- 29 Second Session. Such reappropriation shall retain any provided
- 30 limitations established by the appropriating legislative bill unless
- 31 otherwise indicated within this act and any other legislative bill passed

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1 by the One Hundred Seventh Legislature, Second Session, or the One

- 2 Hundred Eighth Legislature, First or Second Session.
- 3 Sec. 5. CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES.
- 4 All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2025, and June 30,
- 5 2026, not otherwise reappropriated pursuant to this act, are hereby
- 6 appropriated for FY2025-26 and FY2026-27, respectively, which amounts
- 7 shall be in addition to the amounts shown in this act.
- 8 Sec. 6. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.
- 9 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual,
- 10 and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature,
- 11 are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act,
- 12 except as provided in sections 9, 10, and 11 of this act.
- 13 Sec. 7. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.
- 14 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the
- 15 proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the
- 16 appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper
- 17 documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the
- 18 appropriate funds.
- 19 Sec. 8. BUDGET STATUS REPORTS.
- 20 All state agencies, boards, and commissions shall promptly establish
- 21 their detailed Budget Status Reports at the budget subprogram level in
- 22 the Nebraska Accounting System and adjust them as necessary during each
- 23 fiscal year to reflect the most current appropriations shown on the
- 24 Allotment Status Report.
- 25 **Sec. 9.** GIFTS.
- 26 Any gift shall be accepted in accordance with the State Acceptance
- 27 of Gifts Act. The definitions in the State Acceptance of Gifts Act are
- 28 hereby adopted by the Legislature for purposes of this act.
- 29 Any gift made available to the State of Nebraska for any purpose or
- 30 purposes, together with the income from such gift, shall be allocated to
- 31 the state agency designated by the donor or, if no state agency is

1 designated by the donor, shall be used in accordance with Article VII,

- 2 section 9, of the Constitution of Nebraska.
- 3 At the discretion of the budget administrator of the budget division
- 4 of the Department of Administrative Services and the Accounting
- 5 Administrator of the Department of Administrative Services, expenditures
- 6 of funds from any gift of money may be made through any existing or
- 7 administratively created cash fund, revolving fund, or trust fund, in
- 8 which case the actual amount of the gift is hereby appropriated to the
- 9 expending agency, for the purpose or purposes designated by the donor, in
- 10 addition to the amounts appropriated in this act. If no such cash fund,
- 11 revolving fund, or trust fund exists, the Accounting Administrator may
- 12 create such fund as is necessary to properly and separately account for
- 13 the gift, in which case the actual amount of the gift is hereby
- 14 appropriated to the expending agency, for the purpose or purposes
- designated by the donor, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this
- 16 act.
- 17 This section shall not apply to the University of Nebraska.
- 18 Sec. 10. LIMITATION ON SALARIES, WAGES, AND PER DIEMS.
- 19 (1) For purposes of this act, (a) SALARY LIMIT shall mean total
- 20 expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems and (b)
- 21 total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems
- 22 shall mean all remuneration paid to employees treated as taxable
- 23 compensation by the Internal Revenue Service or subject to social
- 24 security coverage, specifically including payments accounted for as
- 25 vacation, holidays, sick leave, military leave, funeral leave, maternity
- 26 leave, administrative leave, compensatory time, deferred compensation, or
- 27 any other similar form, and amounts withheld pursuant to law, but
- 28 excluding state contributions for social security, retirement, and
- 29 employee insurance plans.
- 30 (2) Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per
- 31 diems shall be limited to the amount shown except when federal funds in

- 1 excess of the amount shown are available and approved by the Governor.
- 2 Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from such
- 3 grants shall be in addition to the limitation on permanent and temporary
- 4 salaries and per diems otherwise shown in this act. No agency shall
- 5 request any state funds for continuation or replacement of any such
- 6 personnel or activities in future budget requests. To the extent
- 7 feasible, requests for increases in the limitation on permanent and
- 8 temporary salaries and per diems shall be addressed to the Appropriations
- 9 Committee of the Legislature when the Legislature is in session.
- 10 (3) Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries resulting from
- 11 awards made to employees under sections 81-1346 to 81-1354 shall be in
- 12 addition to the limitations on permanent and temporary salaries and per
- 13 diems otherwise shown in this act.
- 14 (4) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary
- 15 salaries and per diems for FY2026-27 as enumerated in this act shall be
- 16 the basis for continuation funding for each fiscal year of the succeeding
- 17 biennium.
- 18 (5) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary
- 19 salaries and per diems for FY2025-26 shall be increased by certified
- 20 encumbrance amounts from FY2024-25 for permanent and temporary salaries
- 21 and per diems. The limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary
- 22 salaries and per diems for FY2026-27 shall be increased by certified
- 23 encumbrance amounts from FY2025-26 for permanent and temporary salaries
- 24 and per diems. Encumbered amounts shall be calculated in accordance with
- 25 section 81-138.01.
- 26 (6) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary
- 27 salaries and per diems shall only apply to remuneration paid to state
- 28 employees or per diem payments made to members of state boards or
- 29 commissions.
- 30 (7) The budget administrator of the budget division of the
- 31 Department of Administrative Services may administratively increase the

- 1 limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per
- 2 diems upon receipt of a request for such increase from the director of a
- 3 state agency certifying the actual amount of the payment to a former
- 4 employee of such agency, or such employee's beneficiary upon the death of
- 5 the employee, of accumulated vacation and sick leave pursuant to section
- 6 81-1325 and the rules and regulations of the State Personnel System
- 7 governing such payments.
- 8 **Sec. 11.** It is the intent of the Legislature that state agencies
- 9 may, at their discretion, utilize employee furloughs as a short-term
- 10 means of addressing budgetary shortfalls. Furlough is defined as placing
- an employee in a temporary, nonduty, nonpay status because of the lack of
- 12 funds. An intermittent furlough is a furlough action in which the
- 13 nonduty, nonpay status occurs discontinuously over a period of time
- 14 rather than consecutively. It is further intended that furloughs shall
- 15 not adversely affect the employee and employer health insurance premium
- 16 contributions and service anniversary date, nor shall leave earnings be
- 17 prorated as a result of the furlough.
- 18 **Sec. 12.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 19 appropriations for capital facilities follow an orderly and reasonable
- 20 process based upon defined and documented need and an analysis of the
- 21 utilization of existing facilities.
- The biennial appropriations contained in this act covering FY2025-26
- 23 and FY2026-27, which have been designated for planning, require from the
- 24 agency a complete program statement prepared in accordance with the
- 25 Procedural Manual for Capital Construction Projects as approved by the
- 26 state building division of the Department of Administrative Services.
- 27 Projects directly related to program continuation such as fire and life
- 28 safety, maintenance, utility improvements, handicapped access, and master
- 29 planning require a statement of needs prepared in accordance with the
- 30 manual. An appropriation for drawings and construction may be recommended
- 31 only after submission of an acceptable program statement or statement of

- 1 needs on or before September 15 to the state building division, the
- 2 budget division of the Department of Administrative Services, and the
- 3 Legislative Fiscal Analyst.
- 4 Program statements that have been submitted prior to FY2025-26 shall
- 5 be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2025,
- 6 to September 1, 2025. Program statements that have been submitted prior
- 7 to FY2026-27 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the
- 8 period July 1, 2026, to September 1, 2026, by agency priority. Such
- 9 priority shall be subject to final modification by the governing
- 10 authority of each agency on or before September 15, 2026.
- 11 Sec. 13. It is the intent of the Legislature that agencies should
- 12 construct or renovate facilities in such a manner as to provide the
- 13 greatest cost-effective energy savings possible. Design criteria
- 14 emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy conservation shall be
- 15 reflected in program statements, schematic design documents, design
- 16 development documents, and construction documents. The state building
- 17 division of the Department of Administrative Services and the Department
- 18 of Water, Energy, and Environment shall provide technical assistance to
- 19 the state agencies, upon request, to assist them in providing for energy-
- 20 efficient new or renovated facilities.
- 21 Sec. 14. AGENCY NO. 3 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
- 22 The Department of Administrative Services shall monitor the
- 23 appropriations and expenditures for this agency for FY2025-26 and
