- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Department of Transportation; to amend section 39-1355, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 39-1348, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2024; to change provisions relating to solicitation of bids; to change the threshold required for legislative consent relating to certain construction projects; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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**Section 1.** Section 39-1348, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2024, is amended to read:
- 3 39-1348 (1) Except as otherwise provided in sections 39-2808 to
- 4 39-2823, when letting contracts for the construction, reconstruction,
- 5 improvement, maintenance, or repair of roads, bridges, and their
- 6 appurtenances, the department shall solicit bids as follows:
- 7  $\frac{(a)(i)}{(a)}$  For contracts with an estimated cost, as determined by
- 8 the department, of greater than two hundred fifty thousand dollars, the
- 9 department shall provide notice of the department's solicitation of
- 10 advertise for sealed bids using the following methods: for not less than
- 11 twenty days by publication of a notice thereof
- 12 <u>(A) Publish notice</u> once a week for three consecutive weeks in the
- 13 official county newspaper designated by the county board in the county
- 14 where the work is to be done and in such additional newspaper or
- 15 newspapers as may appear necessary to the department in order to give
- 16 notice of the receiving of bids; and -
- 17 <u>(B) Publish notice on the official web page designated by the</u>
- 18 department beginning at least twenty days before the deadline for receipt
- 19 of bids. The notice will be deemed to comply with this requirement even
- 20 <u>if there are temporary or occasional times when Internet service is down</u>
- 21 or the designated web page is not available for any reason.
- 22 (ii) Such notice advertisement shall identify the general project
- 23 location, state the place where the plans and specifications for the work
- 24 may be inspected, and shall designate the time when the bids shall be
- 25 filed and opened. The newspaper notice shall identify the department's
- 26 <u>official web page where the details of the bid letting may be viewed</u>
- 27 electronically.
- 28 <u>(iii) The notice requirements of this section shall be deemed to</u>
- 29 have been met if notice of the bid solicitation has been published on the
- 30 department's designated web page for at least twenty days prior to the
- 31 <u>time when bids will be opened, even if there is any defect with the</u>

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- 1 newspaper notice described in subdivision (1)(a)(i)(A) of this section,
- 2 <u>including</u>, but not limited to, meeting a publication deadline that has
- 3 been moved by the publisher resulting in an inability to satisfy the
- 4 requirement of three consecutive weeks of published notice.
- 5 (iv) If through no fault of the department publication of such
- 6 notice fails to appear as prescribed in subdivisions (1)(a)(i) and (ii)
- 7 of this section in any newspaper or newspapers in the manner provided in
- 8 this subdivision, the department shall be deemed to have fulfilled the
- 9 requirements of this subdivision; and
- 10 (b) For contracts with an estimated cost, as determined by the
- 11 department, of two hundred fifty thousand dollars or less, the
- 12 department, in its sole discretion, shall either:
- 13 (i) Follow the procedures given in subdivision (a) of this
- 14 subsection; or
- (ii) Request bids from at least three potential bidders for such
- 16 work. If the department requests bids under this subdivision, it shall
- 17 designate a time when the bids shall be opened. The department may award
- 18 a contract pursuant to this subdivision if it receives at least one
- 19 responsive bid.
- 20 (2) The Department of Transportation may adjust the amounts in
- 21 subdivisions (1)(a) and (b) of this section annually on October 1 by the
- 22 percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers
- 23 published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor
- 24 Statistics, at the close of the twelve-month period ending on August 31
- 25 of such year. The amounts shall be rounded to the next highest one-
- 26 thousand-dollar amount.
- 27 **Sec. 2.** Section 39-1355, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 28 amended to read:
- 29 39-1355 (1) The department shall have authority to:
- 30 <u>(a) Purchase purchase</u>, lease, employ, or acquire by other means, all
- 31 needed road materials, machinery, equipment, supplies, services, and

- 1 labor necessary for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance, and
- 2 control of the state highway system and all tools and materials necessary
- 3 to keep such machinery and equipment in repair; and
- 4 (b) Lease . The department shall also have authority to lease,
- 5 purchase, construct, or cause to be constructed, buildings for office
- 6 accommodations, which are necessary in the administration of the duties
- 7 of the department, and buildings for the storing and housing of
- 8 materials, machinery, equipment, and supplies.
- 9 (2) The department shall not ; Provided, that the department may not
- 10 construct or cause to be constructed any building with an estimated cost
- 11 greater than the adjusted dollar amount established for capital
- 12 <u>construction projects in section 81-1114.01</u> exceeding a cost of one
- 13 hundred thousand dollars without the consent of the Legislature.
- 14 (3) The maintenance, protection, and control of the materials,
- 15 machinery, equipment, supplies, tools, and buildings shall be under the
- 16 authority and responsibility of the department.
- 17 Sec. 3. Original section 39-1355, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 18 Nebraska, and section 39-1348, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 19 2024, are repealed.
