**LEGISLATIVE BILL 1073**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act;
- 2 to amend section 60-462, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 3 2024; to define a term; to require commercial motor vehicle driver
- 4 training to include antitrafficking training as prescribed; to
- 5 provide powers and duties for the Attorney General; and to repeal
- 6 the original section.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1       **Section 1.** Section 60-462, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,  
2       2024, is amended to read:

3       60-462 Sections 60-462 to 60-4,189 and section 2 of this act shall  
4       be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act.

5       **Sec. 2.** (1) For purposes of this section, commercial motor vehicle  
6       driver training means any training course or educational program that is  
7       offered in this state for the purpose of teaching or training any person  
8       how to operate a commercial motor vehicle.

9       (2) The curriculum for any commercial motor vehicle driver training  
10      that begins on or after January 1, 2027, shall include a minimum of  
11      thirty minutes of antitrafficking training as prescribed by the Attorney  
12      General.

13      (3)(a) No later than December 1, 2026, the Attorney General shall  
14      prescribe the curriculum and training materials for the antitrafficking  
15      training that is required under subsection (2) of this section.

16      (b) The Attorney General shall review and update such curriculum and  
17      training materials at least once every three years to account for changes  
18      and trends in human trafficking.

19      (4) The Attorney General may collaborate with any organization that  
20      specializes in and offers training materials about the recognition,  
21      prevention, and reporting of human trafficking for commercial motor  
22      vehicle drivers.

23      (5) The Attorney General may adopt and promulgate rules and  
24      regulations to carry out this section.

25      **Sec. 3.** Original section 60-462, Revised Statutes Cumulative  
26      Supplement, 2024, is repealed.
