- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-532, Reissue
 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions related to school
 policies on the involvement of parents, guardians, and educational
- 4 decisionmakers in schools; and to repeal the original section.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-532, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 79-532 (1) The policy required by section 79-531 shall include, but
4 need not be limited to, the following:

5 (a) How the school district will provide access to parents, 6 guardians, or educational decisionmakers concerning textbooks; tests; 7 activities information; digital materials; websites or applications used 8 for learning; training materials for teachers, administrators, and staff; 9 procedures for the review and approval of training materials, learning 10 materials, and activities; and other curriculum materials used in the 11 school district;

(b) How the school district will accommodate requests by parents,
guardians, or educational decisionmakers to attend and monitor courses,
assemblies, counseling sessions, and other instructional activities;

(c) Under what circumstances parents, guardians, or educational
decisionmakers may ask that their children be excused from testing,
classroom instruction, learning materials, activities, guest speaker
events, and other school experiences the parents, guardians, or
educational decisionmakers may find objectionable;

20 (d) How the school district will provide access to records of21 students;

22 (e) What the school district's testing policy will be; and

23 (f) How the school district participates in surveys of students and 24 the right of parents, guardians, or educational decisionmakers to remove 25 their children from such surveys; and -

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(g) A requirement that:

(i) If the school administers a nonanonymous survey requesting that
 students provide sexual information, mental health information, medical
 information, information on health-risk behaviors, religious information,
 information of political affiliation, or any other information that the
 school board deems to be sensitive in nature, the school district shall,

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at least thirty days prior to the administration of the survey, notify 1 2 parents, quardians, and educational decisionmakers of students that are to receive such survey. Such notice shall be made through the school's 3 4 electronic notification system or by physical mail to the address on file 5 for the student. Such notice shall describe the nature and types of questions included in the survey, the purposes and age-appropriateness of 6 7 the survey, how information collected by the survey will be used, who will have access to such information, the steps that will be taken to 8 9 protect student privacy, and whether and how any findings or results of 10 such survey will be disclosed; (ii) Parents, guardians, and educational decisionmakers have the 11 right to: (A) Request that a copy of the survey be sent through the 12 13 school's electronic notification system or physical mail to the address on file for the student, (B) review the questionnaire or survey in person 14 at the school, and (C) exempt their child from participating in the 15 16 survey; (iii) Unless required by federal or state law or regulation, school 17 personnel administering any such survey shall not disclose personally 18 19 identifiable information of a child; and (iv) No survey requesting sexual information of a student shall be 20 administered to any student in kindergarten through grade six. 21 22 (2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require disclosure of information in violation of the federal Family Educational Rights and 23 24 Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, 20 U.S.C. 1232g, or any federal 25 regulations and applicable guidelines adopted in accordance with such

26 act, as such act, regulations, and guidelines existed on January 1, 2024.
