SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I move that the nominations be closed and that this very capable gentleman be proclaimed chairman of this committee by acclamation.

SPEAKER: It has been moved and seconded that the nominations cease and that Senator Mahoney be elected by acclamation. Since I have seen no other persons wishing to make nominations I declare the motion is in order. Everybody in favor say aye, opposed no. Senator Mahoney has been elected as chairman of the Inter-Governmental committee.
