SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President I have a question, Senator Burbach did this include jackets too, or just shirts and ties?

SPEAKER: Senator Burbach do you care to respond?

SENATOR BURBACH: Shirt and tie, and I would like to change that all male members wear shirt and ties, Mr. Clerk, and change that, male members.

SENATOR STAHMER: On occasion I don't wear a tie because the room is so warm and I just wondered if Senator Burbach would be agreeable to a change that we ask the janitor to keep the room about 5 or 10 degrees cooler than it ordinarily is, that way we won't have to be so hot in here. Save fuel.

SPEAKER: The motion before us is the amendment to the original motion to the rules committee which relates to know, shirt and ties. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move that the original rule change as now being (inaudible) be referred back to the rules committee for another hearing.

SPEAKER: Motion now is to refer the rule back to the rules committee and I think the motion is in order. Does any body wish to speak to that motion. The Chair will rule that it will 25 votes in order to refer it back to the committee, is there any further discussion? All those in favor referring the rule back to the rules committee vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Once again have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 13 naves Mr. President and the motion to return.

SPEAKER: The motion is returned, are there other motions on the desk?

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER: Do we have any other resolutions up there? I think that's where we were in the order.

CLERK: We were on rules changes.

SPEAKER: Go ahead on the rules changes.

CLERK: Mr. President I move that the present rule concerning introduction of guests be stricken and the following rule be adopted, no guests shall be introduced during the legislative session, except dignitaries and such dignitaries shall be introduced only upon expressed permission of the presiding officer providing the presiding officer can announce the presence of the visiting group or organizations at his discretion. SPEAKER: Refer to the Rules Committee. Senator Duis for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, as Chairman of the Rules Committee I would ask if Senator Proud would please be present at this particular hearing when we have it, because I do believe we will have to have an exact definition of what a dignitary is and if he would in the meantime think this over just a little bit so that we might have something pretty concrete to go on and I say this completely in a non partisan manner because if you would please Senator Proud.
