CLERK: 38 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Stull, did you wish--motion adopted.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would move for the sanction of the rules so that we can consider having the Committee on Coordination of Higher Education continue, at least thru this session.

SPEAKER: You have Senator Stull's motion. Is there further discussion of the motion? Did I hear a second. Thank you. The question is shall the rules be suspended in order for us to consider the Senator Stull motion. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The chair will observe that it takes 30 votes for the suspension of the rules. Thank you. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Rules are suspended. Motion is introduced, is there any further discussion of the motion? Do you all understand the motion made by Senator Stull? Is there any further discussion of the motion? The question is shall the Committee, shall the Committee be continued? Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Stull, yield a question.

SENATOR SNYDER: I was just wondering here, again for clarification, are we talking about the current committee membership continuing on or is it going to be a whole new ball game up to the discretion of the Executive Board.

SENATOR STULL: In answer to Senator Snyder's question, I think that we should continue with the same members because

SENATOR SNYDER: I did too and I was just going to propose that the current membership be carried over. Those who are not returning with us, those positions to be filled by the Executive Board and they should come from the current Education Committees so that we can have a decent influx here because eventually we do want all our select committees be composed of membership of those Standing Committees with which their expertise lies in. So if we could continue our current committee I think there are one or possibly two vacancies as I recall, but if the old committee could be returned in tact and then the appointees be from the Education Committee and I think the same thing should be done with the Telecommunication Committee.

SPEAKER: The chair would observe that your motion is out of order, Senator Snyder and that this is a vote to continue a Resolution on a study and as such that Resolution doesn't contain the membership or doesn't specify the membership at that time. It would seem, to the chair, that you could work that out.

SENATOR SNYDER: Will the president accept it as a suggestion?

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Mahoney, then Senator Keyes.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, Vince do you have the motion there?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I will come after.
