SENATOR CARPENTER: The Senator made an amendment, has he got a date in mind?

SPEAKER: Pardon me, sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The Senator offers an amendment, does he have a date in mind?

SPEAKER: Senator Warner, do --- response

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I believe I indicated that as an expression point, at least, twenty days for the introduction of bills. At least there should be a cutoff time.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Does all the interim study committees understand that at the end of the twenty days to introduce bills that you will not be able to introduce any more bills.

SENATOR WARNER: As (inaudible) study committee of the ones that are being held over, Senator Carpenter. You still have the route of the standing committees, etc.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I make a substitute motion, May the first.

SPEAKER: Senator Warner, now the proposed amendment

SENATOR WARNER: Did you want me to speak on the amendment to my amendment?

SPEAKER: Just a minute. Let's vote on the original. Yes, Senator Warner, go ahead. You can speak to the amendment. Let's consider that an amendment to the original amended amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have no strong feeling for the twenty day but I also think May 1 is too far in the future, the same as making no limitations. In spirit of compromise, I'd suggest March 1. I cannot amend it at this point because you have two amendments pending.

SPEAKER: The chair thinks we have a compromised amendment which would now be voted on which would state that the date for the end of introduction of bills by those interim standing committees would be March 1. Does anyone wish to speak to that motion at this time? That would be the cutoff date for the introduction of bills by the interim study committees--
