the entire statutes each two years, and so I've put an amendment back in here to allow that a complete set will be issued to each Senator each odd year, so every two years they would have a new set available to them. This would allow that within a four year period that they could have a set here in the capital and a set in their office at home. There are some other small changes which would have come anyhow, but as long as I opened up this section the bill drafter has straightened them out, the changing of the name of the Railway Commission in the copies that they get, that eight copies go to the Nebraska Publication Clearings House, that they should go to each district and county Judge, and to each associate county Judge throughout the State, these would have to be done otherwise, but the main change is that the elected and appointed Senators would receive a complete set for each two years, and I renew my motion to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendment? Senator Warner did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR WARNER: I'm wondering if Senator Simpson will yield to a question?

SPEAKER: Senator Simpson will you yield?

SENATOR WARNER: I'm wondering from your remarks Senator Simpson, is the prime purpose consist of what Senator Barnett mentioned the other day, that there should be two sets to a Senator, one for his office and ~~and~~ for his home, if that's true, then I'm wondering like in my case I think it would be kind of a waste to have five sets, which I would have been able to have if this rule would have been in effect since I've been elected.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Warner I think you could reject a set if you thought you had sufficient at the present time, right. I personally don't feel that I do, because one reason two years ago, we had a change Volume 6, I never received it, even though I signed for it, so my one set is not complete, you never get an up-dating of both sets
